FREE TRADE A GREAT BENEFIT

(Canadian Press) WINNIPEG, Man., Dec. 30.—Free trade agreement between Canada and the British West Indies would be of substantial benefit to both countries in the opinion of Louis J. Williams, of Port of Spain, Trinidad, who spent a day in Winnipeg, prior to leaving over the Canadian National Railways for Vancouver.

Mr. Williams is the governing director of the firm of manufacturers' agents, insurance brokers and general commission merchants which bears his name. His firm is the Trinidad agent for the Canadian National Railways and other Canadian companies, and he is travelling through Canada visiting the firms which his company represents.

British West Indian imports from Canada in 1928 totalled 986,177 pounds, chiefly rubber products, automobiles, lumber products and canned salmon from British Columbia, codfish from Nova Scotia and newsprint from British Columbia and Quebec.

Flour imports equal 310,000 bags of 196 pounds each, of which about 95 per cent is Canadian. Mr. Williams explained, while exports to Canada in 1928, totalled 673,533 pounds, chiefly fruit, sugar, cocoa, asphalt and petroleum. The trade between the two countries, continued Mr. Williams, has grown to the extent that the Canadian National Railways now have five luxurious combined passenger and freight steamers and five all freight steamers plying between them. A free trade treaty with Canada, Mr. Williams said, when British sugar duties are repealed, would permit the

development of the Canadian market for Trinidad sugar, and in this way increase the power of the West Indies to purchase Canadian goods in return.

LATE CHRISTMAS MAIL ARRIVES

(Canadian Press) HALIFAX, N. S., Dec. 30.—A special Canadian National boat train left here yesterday for Montreal and the west with passengers from the Cunard liner Aurania, and the White Star liner Megantic, which arrived in port on Sunday from England. The passengers, who spent Christmas at sea reported that the old ocean was in a boisterous mood that day, but that the festivities were just as merry as if they had been ashore. The special train also took six carloads of mail, mostly Christmas letters and parcels that missed the previous boats. It was the second largest mail to be landed here this season coming here under Canadian National Railways auspices, today three more liners are due in port with passengers from British and continental ports.

Eight men were arrested and files seized yesterday at the luxuriously equipped suite located on the fifth floor of the American Bond and Mortgage Company building in the loop business district. The raid followed announcement that Police Commissioner Grover Whalen of New York and Commissioner William F. Russell of Chicago had agreed to combine forces to stamp out the activities of the extortionists.
