THE WEST QUEBENS CANVAS.

From all parts of the constituency of West Queens THE GUARDIAN hears the most pleasant tidings of the generally and rapidly increasing favor with which Mr. Hazard's candidature is received. This is not so much the effect of any active canvass made on his own behalf or by his numerous friends and supporters as it is the recognition of the fact that it is clear, in the interest of the Riding, the City and the Province that he shall be our next representative at Ottawa.

They find the canvass on his behalf put forward calmly, confidently and good naturedly, upon the merits, and it appeals to their reason and good judgment. They see that from the beginning Mr. Hazard has acted with fairness and good judgment; that he knows his own mind and does not suddenly change it from motives of caprice or of self-interest; that even his opponents have felt compelled to testify to his standing and character as a business man; that his knowledge of every Island industry and interest is second to none, and that he possesses the ability, tact and good judgment which fit a man to be a representative of the better and more influential class.

The people like fair, candid and straightforward methods. They like to have a freedom of choice, to feel that they are masters of the situation. They are disposed to resent the claim of any man to the sole right of being their representative to the exclusion of all others. They refuse to be dragged into support of any man merely because he selfishly demands it, or because a clique of contractors, office-holders and office-seekers say it must be done. They weary of the fulsome praises of himself poured out day by day from the personal organ of one who

controls and directs it as much and as exclusively as he controls his knife and fork at his own dinner table.

The intelligent electorate fail to see why the angry abuse and vituperation of the Patriot should move them, against their better judgment, to support its candidate. The time was when under the editorial direction of Hon. David Laird, the Patriot was a power in the land. It was then conducted with ability, with manliness and with self-respect. Under Mr. Laird's direction the Patriot stood for honesty in public affairs, for clean politics, for temperance, for the Sabbath, for every good cause. Its columns were not then open to advocate prohibition today and the licensed saloon to-morrow—not open to the mudslingers from the slums, the convicts of the police court. They see what it has now become, and they know who now directs it. "What a falling-off was there, my country men!"

Thus the narrow, angry and vituperative methods of the Farquharson organ and its fall from its once reputable estate, have forfeited the respect of the reading public, and, coupled with his own vacillating course and defiance of the moral sentiment of the community have made his chariot wheels roll heavily. Powerless because of this to persuade support, the effort is being made to drag the wavering supporters into line. But intelligent electors whether Liberal or Conservative are not thus to be controlled. So the situation stands at present, and there is good reason to hope that the free voice of an intelligent electorate will decide the controversy in a calm and rational manner, according to right, justice and fair play.

The outbreak of smallpox in Ontario, Quebec, and at various points in the Maritime Provinces sounds a clear note of warning to our local health authorities to be ready. Already some steps have been taken toward creating a hospital for contagious diseases. The enterprise ought to be pressed to completion as speedily as possible. Last winter we narrowly escaped invasion from the dread disease which lingered for months on the mainland border. The winter is the harvest season for smallpox and is now much more widely prevalent in Canada than in any previous October that we can remember.

A movement has been on foot in Boston to raise the \$110,000 demanded by the brigands in ransom for Miss Stone, the abducted missionary. Down to October 7 \$56,000 had been raised, of which all but \$10,000 was in cash and the latter in pledges. The question of paying a ransom at all has been strongly debated on the ground that if it is paid the brigands will be incited to speedily seize another victim. On the other hand it would be an awful thing if because the money is not forthcoming the lady missionary should be put to death as the brigands threaten. They have in the past too often carried out their deadly threats.

We regret to notice a considerable increase of drunkenness on our streets. The violators have become bolder since the dismissal of Mr. D. W. Henderson. And why was he dismissed?

The Patriot, which has been blowing hot and cold on the subject of conventions has now apparently great fear that the coming Liberal convention may be "packed." This is apparently in preparation for bolting in case the convention should not nominate its favorite. There was once a case of that kind which the Patriot's director no doubt has still fresh in his memory.
