TORONTO TEACHERS TO DEMAND AN INCREASE

TORONTO, Jan. 18.—Teachers of two schools both high and public are demanding a real revision of the salary schedule this year. They want a boost that varies from \$200 to \$500 a year, according to grades, and they also ask that the annual increment under the salary grading bylaw be doubled for 1918. At present the male teachers' maximum salary is \$3,200, and minimum \$1,500. Women teachers get from \$600 to \$2,200 per year.

Food Controller Quotes Authoritative Figures in Comparison

That food prices in Canada were lower than in the United States except in four "minor instances and lower in Great Britain despite frequent irresponsible statements to the contrary, was the emphatic announcement of Hon. W. J. Hanna, Food Controller, addressing the May Court Club in the city of Ottawa on December 14. Mr. Hanna also startled his hearers by announcing that the United States has not a bushel of wheat for export over and above normal consumption requirements.

"Why is Canadian bacon cheaper in Great Britain than in Canada?" asked Mr. Hanna. "It is for this reason, and this reason only: it is because it isn't! That is to say, bacon is not cheaper in Great Britain. It costs more in England than in Canada by the amount of the cost of the transportation from this country to Great Britain."

He quoted average figures from the National Food Bulletin, issued by Lord Rhonda, British Food Controller, as follows:

WAR MENUS

How to Save Wheat, Beef and Bacon for the men at the front. Issued from the Office of the Food Controller for Canada

MENU FOR WEDNESDAY

- Breakfast: Cornmeal Porridge, Marmalade, Toast, Coffee. Dinner: Beef Loaf, Baked Potatoes, Parsnips, Tapioca Pudding. Supper: Corn Soup, Wholewheat Bread, Crackers, Jam, Tea.

The recipe for Wholewheat Bread, mentioned above, is as follows:

Whole Wheat Bread—5 cups sifted whole wheat flour, 2 cups milk, 1/2 cup molasses, 1/2 cup yeast cake dissolved in 1/2 cup warm water, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt.

Mix milk, sugar, or molasses and salt. When lukewarm add yeast cakes dissolved in warm water and flour. Beat well. Let rise until nearly double its bulk. Beat, turn into greased bread pans. Let rise until nearly double its bulk, and bake for about one hour in a moderately hot oven.

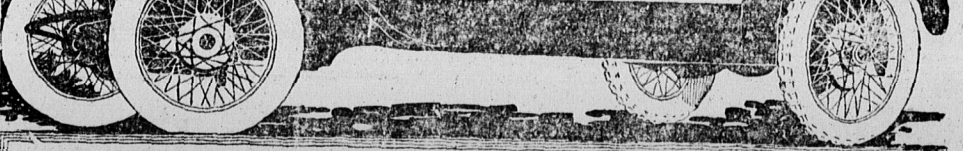
