SPEECH IN HOUSE AMAZES LONDON

Reference To Jap And British Fleets Against A Common Enemy

MONTREAL, Feb. 2.—A special London cable says: Sir Wilfrid Laurier's speech in the Canadian house of commons, as reported here, creates much astonishment in political and diplomatic circles. When a responsible statesman like Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in parliament, talks of Japan and England riding the waves together against a common enemy, the inevitable question was asked, "What is the common enemy and what extraordinary combination of influences could bring Sir Wilfrid's decided contingency within the terms of the Japanese treaty?"
As Archibald Colquhoun, a well known writer and war correspondent, explains in the Morning Post today, the Japanese treaty, as published, is concerned alone with the maintenance of an open door for the P. C. nations here and does not really think that the United States, for instance, is sending her battle fleet to the Pacific as an act of aggression upon Asia, China and Japan, and that Canadian shores may be endangered by the result of a future hostilities.

A BOLD REBUKE FOR SOCIETY

Scandal In In Warwickshire Hunting Set Minister Of Church Of England To Direct Action In Disregard Of Bishop's Wishes

LONDON, Feb. 2.—Society throughout England is deeply stirred by a scandal in the exclusive hunting circles of Warwickshire, where two Anglican clergymen, revealing themselves to some extent, replicas in real life of John Storm, the hero of Hall Caine's novel, "The Christain" have just resigned their pastorates on account of what they term the "excessive immorality" among the high society of their districts.
In announcing his decision to give up his place, the rector and honorary Canon of Hampton-Lucy, in the Diocese of Worcester, which carries with it a living of almost \$5,000, and was given him by Lady Ramsey "Fairfax-Lucy in 1874, the Rev. Herbert Mordaunt declares that he is unable longer to regard the injunction of silence imposed by his bishop, but must, as the follower of the master speak out boldly. The Rev. F. Tobin, the Rural Dean of North Kingston, has followed closely Mr. Mordaunt's action with a similar declaration. He was once famous as a Cambridge athlete.

Warwickshire, as a hunting district is, of course, one of the most exclusive in all England, and several of those following the hounds there almost every season possess titles of ancient, if not famous lineage. The present climax resulted from the refusal of the vicar of a well-known parish to celebrate holy communion in the presence of a wealthy man and woman, both of high social position, whose names had been linked together by scandalous gossip.
The man in question later expressed his high indignation, and the vicar made matters worse by blindly writing a letter to both the man and woman explaining the exact reasons of his action. For some time the lighted worshippers talked of bringing

FEWER EXAMS IN THE SCHOOL

Stress Of Exams Injurious Affects Preparation Of Pupils
TORONTO, Feb. 2.—The Minister of Education recently issued an important circular on the examination question. It is expected that in due course the pressure of examinations will cease to be a dominant influence in schools.
The Minister in his circular says that under the existing system too often the chief aim of education, which is formation of character, was lost sight of and the stress affected injuriously the methods of teaching and preparation of pupils on the practical duties of life.
The minister then went on: "Complaints have been increased late that in very many cases the product of our secondary schools do not possess what have long been regarded as essentials of a practical education. They are too often poor in spelling, penmanship, reading and letter writing, and in elementary operations of arithmetic by are lacking in speed and accuracy. These complaints are well founded."
