KING CONSENTS TO ASQUITH'S DEMAND

NEW YORK, Feb. 9.—A special cable to the Tribune from its London correspondent says:—

"The information previously sent by the Tribune's correspondent that the King had consented to the Prime Minister's demand for guarantees has been confirmed today by admissions from the Unionists. Prominent persons concede that what they describe as qualified guarantees have been obtained for the creation of a majority in the Upper House in a certain contingency, but they express the confident expectation that a compromise will be effected and that the privileged order will not be discredited by a burlesque performance by the Opposition.

"The tactics were not disclosed in opening debates on the Address in Reply to the Speech from the Throne but were explained in conversation by Unionist members of the Upper House.

"They expect Lord Lansdowne with Lord Rosebery's help to produce a definite reform scheme and carry it through the Lords before the passage of the Veto Bill by the Commons.

"They will then be in a position to make the point that the preamble to the Veto Bill has been anticipated, and that a compromise should be brought about in a conference of the two Houses when that measure reaches the committee stage of the Lords, after Coronation.

TWO MORE FRENCH AVIATORS KILLED

DOUX, France, Feb. 9.—Two more names were added to the death roll of the aeroplans today. The aviators Noel and Delatore were killed while conducting a trial of a military aeroplane before experts from the war department, previous to its delivery to the army. Noel was the pilot and Delatore was a passenger.

DANGEROUS MEDICINES

BALTIMORE, Feb. 9.—Certain patent medicines advertised as cures for tuberculosis were the target against which a sharp attack was aimed last night by Dr. Lyman F. Kelber, of the United States Department of Agriculture, in an address before the health conference now in progress under the auspices of the Medical and Surgical Faculty of Maryland. Dr. Kelber alleged that many of the patent medicines advertised as marvellous cures for the white plague are not as represented, and are absolutely worthless—dangerous, even, as they contain opium and other injurious drugs, and cause those who have taken them to become victims of the cocaine or opium habit.

PEAT TO BURN IN CANADA FOR CENTURIES

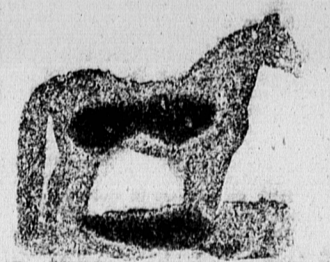
