**-DEATH OF FORMER RESIDENT OF HOPE RIVER**—The death took place on Monday at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. John Alex. Stewart, of West Point, of Mrs. Daniel Sullivan at the great age of 92 years. She had enjoyed remarkably good health until the past few weeks and the end came quite unexpectedly. The deceased lady was born at Clifton, her maiden name being Miss Helen O'Connor, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Michael O'Connor. She was the widow of the late Mr. Daniel Sullivan, who was a brother of the late Hon. W. W. Sullivan, a former Premier and also former Chief Justice of P. E. Island. After her marriage she lived all her wedded life at Hope River. Her husband purchased a store and farm at O'Leary, but upon taking possession was stricken with pneumonia and died. His son conducted the store for some years and still retains the farm, where the deceased had resided with him for the past twenty years, very deeply respected by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance. **-A GOOD PIECE OF WORK**—Mr. Chester Palmer, Chairman of the Summerside Water and Sewerage Commissioners, and his colleagues on the Board are being congratulated upon the completion of the new fifty foot chimney shaft at the Pumping Station. When this work was started many citizens predicted that it would cost in the vicinity of \$3,000, but they are now gratified to know that a splendid job has been done, and that the finished cost of the work is only \$1,486.12, which reflects much credit upon the contractor, Mr. H. M. Downing, and all concerned. The work embraced the demolition of the old brick chimney, which had

been condemned, the entire removal of its foundation and extensive excavation for the new foundation for a pedestal thirteen feet in height, with spread base, to carry the new fifty foot shaft, which is overlaid throughout with new hand reinforced concrete, with thirty-four inch cast-iron smoke pipe, safe and other necessary appliances and improvements. All the brick used is laid in the best cement mortar and the interior is waterproofed throughout. All in all, it is a job worthy of inspection by all citizens interested. S
