Livestock

MONTREAL, May 21—(CP)—There were eight cattle, eight sheep, 114 hogs and 228 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.

Prices on all classes of livestock were strong.

There were not enough cattle and sheep ordered to make a market.

Veal calves ranged from \$7 to \$11 with select \$10.70 to \$11.50 with the bulk between \$8 and \$9. Dr. markers or fall fed calves including common veals were sold mostly \$6.50 to \$7. Grassers \$4.50 to \$5.

There was a firm undertone to the hog market and no early sales.

The markets will be closed on May 24, for all trading.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, May 21—(CP)—Insignificant losses were recorded in the index by the industrial and mining stocks on the Toronto exchange in today's operations. Volume at 104,000 shares, was up 33,000 shares from Tuesday's trade.

Goldie traded 17,500 shares without moving away from the 12-cent mark and Central Porcupine was active on a gain of 1-2 to 20. Jackson Mines weakened 1-2 to 37 and Gunnar was down 1-2 to 23 1-2.

Among the higher-price issues better prices were noted for Wright-Hargreaves, Preston and Leitch while the close was down narrowly for Anor, Lamaque, Pamour, Pickle Crow and San Antonio.

Loss of 1-4 point for Nickel was the only change in the senior base metal list and Steep Rock and Ventures had minor losses among the cheaper issues.

Bell Telephone, Economic Investments, Mercury Mills and Tip Top Tailor pfd had losses in points and fractional declines appeared for several of the interlisted leaders including Canadian National, Loblaw and Pressed Metals. Walkers common tightened up 1-4 to 44 and Distillers-Seagrams firmed 1-4 to 19. The Beatty Bros. shares firmed fractions and fractions were added by Consolidated Bakeries, Imperial Oil, Laura Secord and Sage Hersey. Consomers Gas firmed a point and Dominion Woollens common advanced 50 cents to \$1.

Home Oil gained 2 cents to 1.63.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, May 21—(CP)—Trading trickled through a dull session of the stock market today. Price changes were grooved in a narrow range with a tendency to irregularity.

Bell Telephone was a weak spot, in utilities, Montreal Power recovered an early loss and Shawinigan failed to hold an improvement.

Mines were weaker, International Nickel and Noranda both ceding ground. Papers were also headed downward, Bathurst "A" and St. Lawrence Corporation "A" dropped fractions.

Some strength was apparent in industrials, where Massey-Harris stuck to its opening gain, and Electroflux jumped 1-4. In the remainder of the list, issues sold at Tuesday's levels, except Alcohol "A" which was moderate harder.
