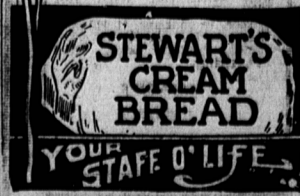

PASSION PLAY DESCRIBED—An enjoyable entertainment and lecture was heard last night by a large audience which filled Hertz Hall almost to capacity. The meeting was presided over by Prof. G. D. Steele was opened by prayer by Rev. Mr. Ryan. This was followed by a hymn and several selections by a quartette consisting of Mrs. Fletcher, Miss Cheshire, Mr. R. McKee and Mr. G. F. Hutcheson with Prof. Fletcher as the accompanist. In his illustrated lecture on the Passion Play at Oberammergau Mr. James Paton depicted the event very realistically, taking his audience in imagination through the different periods of the play, first at Jerusalem; thence to Bethlem; to Jerico, the River Jordan; to the Samaritan Inn, to Bethany and back to Jerusalem. He described the powerful characters particularly Anton Lang who took the part of Christ. Explanation was given of the origin of the play in 1632. It has been played every ten years since with the exception of 1920, when the date was changed to 1922 on account of the war disturbance. Vocal music by the Quartette during the presentation of the pictures added much to the charm of the entertainment. At the conclusion a warm vote of thanks, moved by Mr. C. H. Black and seconded by Dr. Avers, was tendered Mr. Paton, the members of the Quartette and Prof. Fletcher. z z z z z
