NORTH BAY, Jan. 16-Joseph Thibodeau, of Salem, Mass., mail carrier for Heettler's Lumber Camp, on the South Shore of Lake Nipissing was frozen to death having died from cold and exposure while making a trip to the camp.

ALBION, N. Y., Jan. 13-An engine running wild and a crowded passenger train in its path was a situation that caused New York Central officials several minutes of keen anxiety tonight. Quick work on the telegraph wires prevented a disaster and resulted in the capture of the derelict after it had covered fifteen miles on the main line.

How the engine happened to get away is a question for the railroad men. The crew left it standing on a siding when they went to supper. A few minutes later a tower man reported it on the main line without a hand at the throttle and increasing its speed every second. The next tower reported it going at forty miles an hour. Immediately the wires became hot with plans to clear the track and capture the runaway. The passenger train was caught by a matter of seconds, and sidetracked. A freight engine was detached and sent in pursuit from here. The runaway was captured between Holly and Brookport where it had slowed down on an up grade and because of loss of steam.

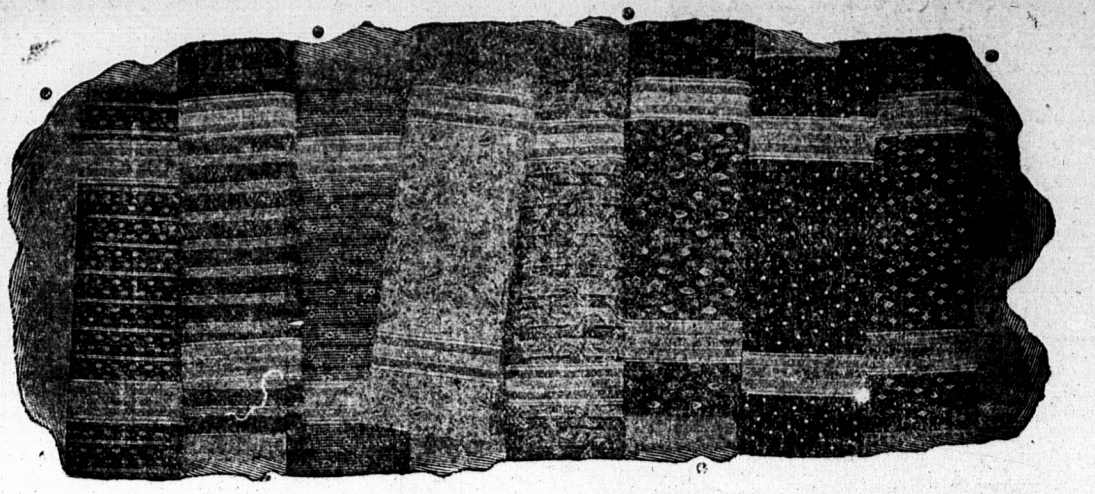
