BOYS CRACK SAFE AND CLUB CAPTOR

NEW YORK, April 11—Two boys, neither of them vicious in appearance, and both American born, got into the office of Joline, Larkin & Radcliffe, lawyers, in the Central Trust building, and stole \$32 out of the safe, and on being discovered, blackjacked Frank Harmon, the superintendent of the building and made a desperate attempt to get away by sliding down a water pipe from the roof of the building to the roof of the five-story building adjoining at 52 Wall Street.

John Berry, one of the boys, fractured his skull in trying to get away, and is dying in the Hudson Street Hospital. The other boy, Lawrence Bonnie, of 632 Third Avenue, made the descent of four stories in safety and was arrested later.

Harmon, the superintendent of the building, was terribly wounded in the back of the head by the blackjack, the end of which was made of a piece of iron pipe. Bonnie, the boy who escaped death in the descent from the roof, was identified by Harmon as the boy who blackjacked him. Harmon will recover. Only the extraordinary hardness of his skull saved his life.

The two boys, neither of whom is 20 years of age, had worked their job with the skill of veteran safe-crackers. How they managed to get into Mr. Joline's office is a mystery. Berry, the dying boy, the police say, is a discharged office boy once in the employ of Mr. Joline. It was about 8:30 when Mr. Harmon started on one of his nightly inspections of the building.
