BOLSHAYA GLOBA ON THE POST ROAD AROUND LAKE BAIKAL.

The stretch of rails from Moscow through Asia ends at the western shore of Lake Baikal and a military post road 50 feet in width, and much like the great Roman roads of the old empire, runs around the southern end of the lake and up again to the Trans-Baikal division, where the railway proper begins once more. In winter this trip of 200 miles must be taken in broken marches, and all along the post road the Czar's Government has scattered impressive villages. Of these Bolshaya-Globa is the most important, and rejoices in a permanent population of over three hundred, aside from the regular garrison of a captain and fifty men and the constantly coming and going of regiments bound for the war.

REGATTA ON PICTOU HARBOR.

This regatta, which is designed primarily for fishing boats and for yachts of small and moderate size, is to be sailed on Pictou Harbor, one of the most beautiful of all the harbors of the Atlantic coast, and one of the finest sheets of water for small boat sailing in North America. The prizes are given by the citizens of Pictou.

DIVISION II. YACHTS.

In yacht construction in Gulf of St. Lawrence waters within the last few years the building of one design classes has been practically unknown. There is every possible variation, from five-keel boats, forty foot or more over all, and drawing eight or nine feet of water, to small centerboard craft of ten or twelve feet waterline. As it is the intention of the management to entirely eliminate handicap races from this regatta, they have, of course, been unable to arbitrarily establish classes without knowing first the approximate dimensions and sail areas of possible entering yachts. The management would be much obliged if yacht owners who are willing to sail at Pictou, if they can be classed to their own satisfaction, will communicate with Mr. Hickman at the earliest possible moment, and furnish him with the necessary information as to their boats, including the length over all. Classes will then be formed and cups or other suitable prizes offered. It is sincerely hoped that yachtsmen of the nearby New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia mainland and Cape Breton ports, who are within easy cruising distance, and who would naturally visit Pictou to see the fishing boat race, will respond to this invitation, and make the regatta what it already promises to be, one of the finest ever held in Eastern Canadian waters.

ENTRANCE FEE FOR YACHTS \$1.00.

All entrance money will be devoted to the regatta, as far as possible towards directly increasing the prize list in the class to which it belongs.

Entries must be made before 4 p. m. on Saturday, August 6th. The management, at their discretion, may accept or reject entries offered later. It is especially requested that boats in both divisions be entered at the earliest possible date. All boats must be presented for measurement before 6 p. m. on Tuesday, August 9.

If, in the opinion of the management, the wind and weather conditions are unfavorable on August 10 the race will be postponed until the following day, Thursday, August 11. The number of races to be sailed will be possible necessitate two days racing in any case.

DIVISION I. FISHING BOATS.

Under this division the management have decided to form two classes of fishing boats proper, to include lobster boats and others.

CLASS I.

The conditions necessary to make a boat eligible for entrance in this class are the following:— 1.—The boat must not be more than

twenty-five feet in length over all, measured between perpendiculars erected at the extremities of stem and stern projections.

2.—The boat must have been regularly engaged in fishing during the present season, the season of 1904.

—First Prize \$100. Second Prize \$50. Entrance fee, \$1.

CLASS II.

The conditions necessary to make a boat eligible for entrance in this class are the following:—

1.—The boat must not be more than thirty-four (34) feet over all, measured as above.

2.—The boat must have been regularly engaged in fishing during the present season, the season of 1904.

—First prize, \$30.00, second prize, \$10.00; entrance fee \$1.00.

[In both of these classes the phrase "regularly engaged in fishing during the present season" refers only to the hull and is not intended to imply that the boat must use the same suit of sails with which she has fished.] Any protests as to the right of any boat to sail in this division must be made to the management before 4.00 p. m. on Tuesday, August 9. In any case the decision of the management must be accepted as final.
