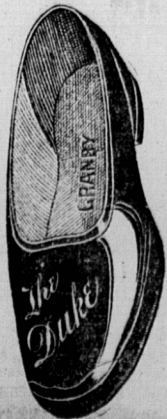

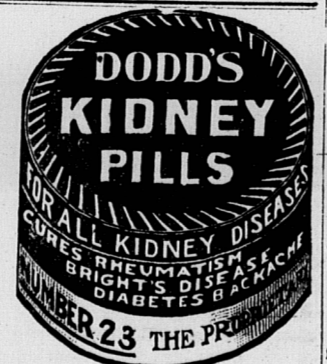
White Rose meeting, Lodge Prince Edward, S. O. E. Tuesday April 20.

DOMINION STEEL CO. WILL PAY UP

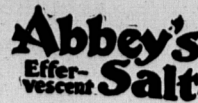
MONTREAL, April 17—The Directors of the Dominion Steel Company have taken their long expected action regarding the payment of back dividends on the preferred stock, and the resumption of regular dividends. Ten and a half per cent. of the arrears will be paid on May 10th to all holders.

The Directors have also announced that regular payments of half-yearly dividends on the preferred stock would be resumed at the beginning of October. The announcement is made that the whole of the back dividends on the preferred stock will be paid off within a year or two, while \$2,000,000 required for the extension of the plant at Sydney has been provided by taking the amount from the consolidated bond issue already provided.

TURKS ON THE MOVE

BERLIN, April 17—A Despatch from Bistowatz, says that after a monster meeting there, the Young Turks telegraphed the Sultan saying, "We are marching on Constantinople in order to save the constitution you are trying to abolish." The Belgrade correspondent of the same paper says that the Turkish Minister there received a dispatch saying that the Pera and Galata quarters of Constantinople, had been bombarded and that two thousand persons were killed.
