P. E. Island Presbytery.

At Charlottetown and within Zion Church there, on Tuesday, July 6th, and at 11 o'clock a. m., which place and time the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted.

The minutes of meetings of May 14th, July 2nd, and July 10th, were read and sustained.

Representative elders' commissions in favor of Duncan McRae, John McDonald, James Harris, Archibald S. Gordon, Angus McPhee, John A. Gillis, W. Munro, T. C. James, Alex. Morrison, Geo. B. McNutt, Wm. McConnell, J. J. McLeod, Wm. Brown, Geo. Simpson, John A. McQueen, Alex. D. McLeod and Samuel Robertson were read and sustained.

On motion Mr. J. W. McKenzie was elected Moderator for the ensuing six months, and T. C. James, Clerk for the year.

Took up O'Leary matters when at the request of Presbytery the clerk read the minutes of committee's meetings in that congregation.

Presbytery then adjourned to meet in the same place at half past two o'clock p. m., of which public intimation was made, and this secedent closed with the Benediction.

Same place and date and at the hour of half-past two p. m., Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted.

Mr. A. McLean Sinclair, on behalf of the committee, appointed to consider Mr. McNeill's reason for appeal to the Synod, reported that the committee did not deem it necessary to prepare answers.

Resembled consideration of the O'Leary matter. After further discussion all understanding was reached that the trial of the case referred back to the session be taken under the jurisdiction of Presbytery.

A request of Mr. Robertson McFadyen for a Presbyterial certificate was read by the Clerk.

Mr. Miller presented the following resolution of sympathy. "The Presbytery hereby places on record its deepest sympathy with our brother, Rev. Malcolm Campbell, and with his family in the irreparable loss they have sustained through the death of Miss Campbell."

On motion this was adopted and a copy ordered to be sent to Mr. Campbell. The committee appointed to strike standing committees reported as follows: Sabbath Schools—Mr. W. H. Smith, Convener.

Home Missions—Mr. T. F. Fullerton, Convener; Messrs. Miller, and McLeod, Ministers; T. C. James, and J. T. McKenzie, Elders.

Augmentation—Mr. W. H. Spencer, Convener; Messrs. Adam Gunn, Stewart, McNeill, W. H. Smith, Murdoch E. Smith, Miller and Campbell, Ministers; and Wm. Laird and J. G. McCann, Elders.

Statistics—T. C. James, Convener; Mr. D. B. McLeod and Mr. W. T. Huggan. Examination of Students—R. McLean, Hebrew; E. Gillis, Greek; R. S. Whidden, Church History; M. Campbell, Theology.

On motion the report was adopted. With regard to the reference as to the tenure of church property, it was allowed to lie on the table.

The clerk reported briefly on the distribution of printed statistics, showing that they had been widely distributed and carefully read.

The report on the Presbytery fund showed that it was in a healthy condition, only one congregation having failed to contribute.

Took up the reference on the globe land at Cavendish. After full discussion it was agreed on motion to appoint a Committee

to confer with the surviving Trustees of the property, a committee of the Board of Trustees of the Cavendish congregation and a committee of the Board of Trustees of New Glasgow congregation with a view to settle the whole question.

On motion of Mr. Fullerton, seconded by Mr. Gillis it was unanimously agreed to nominate Mr. Adam Gunn as Moderator of the forthcoming Synod.

Mr. Spencer reported that the congregation of Murray Harbor North had asked for the appointment of Mr. D. J. McDonald. On motion he was appointed to this field for three months, from August first.

At Covehead at 11 a. m., Brackley Point Road, 3 p. m., and St. Peter's Road at 7 p. m. Mr. MacKay preaching at Montague on the same day, also that Mr. MacKay had been appointed to preach in St. Peter's Road and Covehead congregations for the last two Sabbaths of August.

Presbytery then adjourned the meet at O'Leary on Tuesday, August 27th at half past two o'clock p. m., of which public intimation was made, and this secedent closed with the benediction.

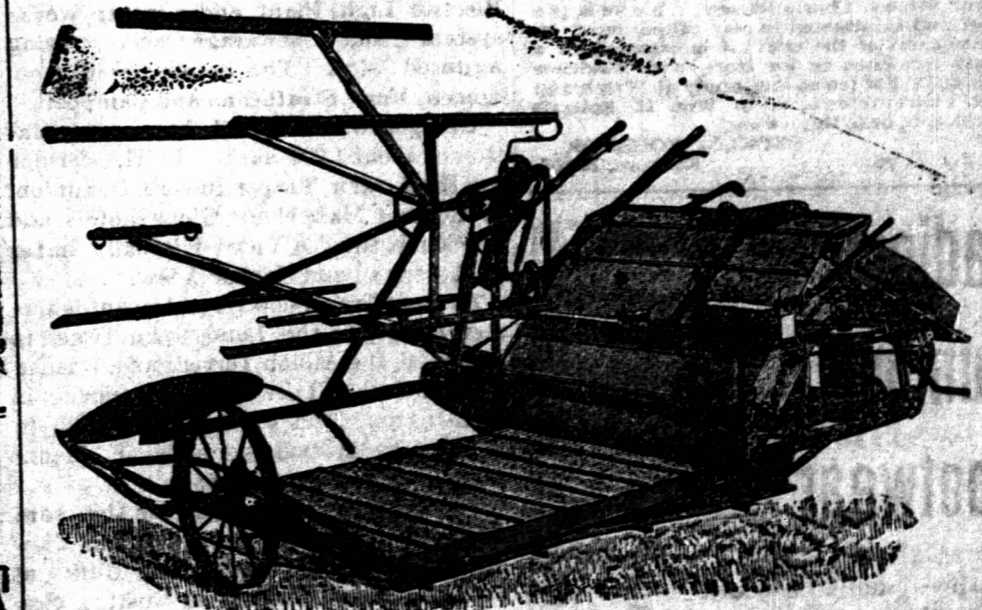
