Merchants and customers alike are anxious for good weather for the remainder of this week. In this connection it will be interesting to note what a recent despatch from the Washington Weather Bureau had to say on this week's forecast on last Saturday. It follows:—There are strong indications that the coming week will be marked by rain or snow and generally unsettled and disagreeable weather throughout the United States, according to a bulletin issued tonight by the Weather Bureau. "Temperatures generally," says the Bulletin, "will undergo decided changes and the precipitation which will be in the form of snow and rain in the Northern, and rain in the Southern districts, will be above the normal. A disturbance that is now over the Western plateau will advance eastward and cross the great central valleys Monday and Tuesday, and reach the Eastern States by Tuesday night or Wednesday." So far gracious weather has been the good fortune of the Garden Province and a continuance of the same will be hoped for and if forthcoming will be duly appreciated.

An Ottawa despatch says:—The new parliament differs from its predecessor. An unusually large number of new men have come to Ottawa; no change like it has been seen since 1896. Among the new members are many young men, and the average age of this house must be considerably lower than that of the preceding assembly. Heretofore, for some years at least, all the young parliamentarians came from the province of Quebec. But in the present house are to be seen quite youthful members from nearly all of the English speaking provinces. Parliaments change rapidly, and although some men retain their seats for a long time, the identity of the house as a whole changes frequently.

For example, of the sixty-five men who came here from Quebec in 1896, only three are to be seen in this parliament. They are Sir Wilfred Laurier, Hon. F. D. Monk and Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux. The proportion of members from Ontario who date back of 1896 is larger, Colonel Sam. Hughes, T. H. Bennett, W. M. MacLean, Hon. J. D. Reid, Mr. Speaker Sproule, Hon. George E. Foster, Hon. John Haggart, David Henderson, W. B. Northrup, and others who might be mentioned, were here from Ontario before 1896, although some of them have not served continuously to this time. Probably a majority of the present house are new members, although in this list would be included Messrs. MacLean, of Halifax; McLean, P. E. I.; Fowler, of King's and Albert; Power, West Quebec; Bennett, of East Simcoe; Clements, of Comox-Atlin, and perhaps one or two others who have been returned to the commons after an interval spent in private life.

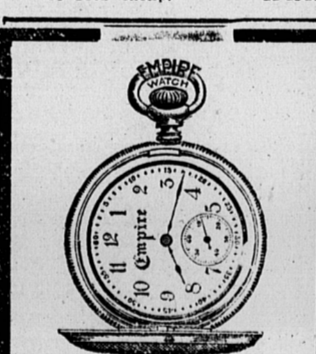
