SANE OR INSANE?

The trial of E. O. Brown now ended by the verdict of insanity has been a strange one from the first. The conflicting testimony of the doctors and expert alienists was not in itself remarkable. Expert testimony is quite usually divided in such cases. But the incident of two juries on successive days, one finding the prisoner sane and the other finding him insane is altogether unique and unprecedented. Public opinion is still somewhat divided, though doubtless now more inclined than at first to accept the theory of the insanity of the prisoner. But in the eye of the law the prisoner is and has been insane and perhaps that theory best explains many features of this extraordinary and most regrettable case.

And yet insanity has been many times successfully feigned. David deceived the Philistines in this way many hundreds of years ago, by incoherent speech, scrabbling on the doors and allowing his spittle to run down over his beard, as told in sacred story, and there have been thousands of instances since. A strong and well supported case of insanity has been frequently made out in defence of prisoners who were quite as sane as the average jurymen in the box, while the accused was secretly laughing in his sleeve and greatly amused by the course of the trial. We do not write this to raise, or to increase doubt in the public mind as to the case under review. We accept the verdict of the last jury, and it is better that all should do so, at least until they find stronger reasons for dissent therefrom than have so far appeared in evidence.

No doubt the great majority of the women who come to market with poultry, eggs, butter and other farm and garden products are honest, and it is not altogether surprising that there should be sometimes an exception, if only to prove the truth of the rule. On Friday last, as The Guardian is informed one of these exceptions sold to a householder in this city a pair of fowl which she guaranteed to be young and tender. Some hours in the pot proved them to be both old and tough. This was flagrantly dishonest, and moreover is an offence against the law and punishable by fine and imprisonment. Some of these fine days, if this sort of thing goes on there will be an example made of such dishonest market traders who sell goods under false pretences.

THE WINTER SERVICE STOPPED.

The fact that already in a winter of most unprecedented mildness the winter steamers have been interrupted by the ice, proves conclusively that steamers alone can never keep up the constant and efficient communication stipulated in the union compact. The recent interruption was a surprise even to our own people under the existing conditions. Not in the memory of living men perhaps has there been such continued mild weather throughout November, December and January, and yet there was ice enough formed to stop the steamers. Had there been instead three months of zero weather, with heavy northeast gales, what would have happened to the winter service? A repetition of the winter of 1905. The only safe and sane remedy is the tunnel.

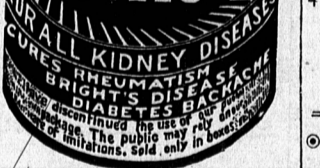
Resolution Of Condolence.
