(Canadian Press) CHICAGO, March 31—(AP)—Wheat prices closed higher Saturday for the first time in five sessions but the advance was feeble and met considerable resistance. Coking quotations were 1-8-1-2 cent higher than yesterday and within 1-8-1-4 of the best levels of the day which were scored early in the session. After the opening advance wheat reacted to slightly below previous closing levels at one stage. May wheat finished at 1.04 5/8-1-2 and July 1.03 3/8-1-4. WISCONSIN, March 31—(CP)—The Winnipeg grain exchange registered slight upturns on support from United States wheat traders yesterday. A firm Chicago wheat market contributed to strong undertone. At the close quotations were 1-8 cent higher to unchanged with May at 85 5/8 cents, July 89 3/4 and Oct 91 1/4. The Chicago market was a little on the upward side after weather forecasts predicted little or no weekend moisture for the parched United States winter wheat belt. Quotations closed 1-8-1-2 above Friday's finish. 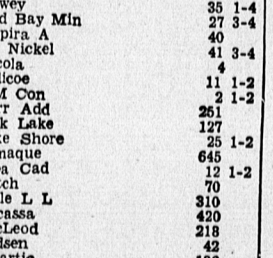

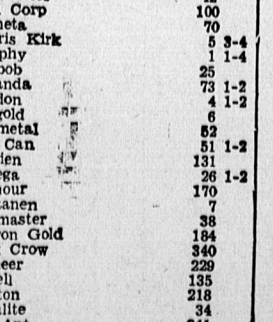

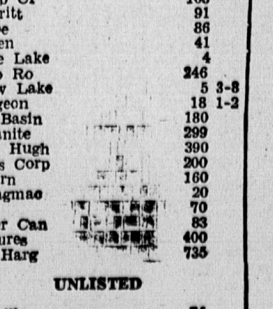
