 executive desire to place on record  
 an expression of its gratitude and  
 tender our sincere thanks to Mr.  
 Hyndman for the interest he has  
 taken in our cause. After deciding to

 tico at an early date the meeting ad-

 Grove.

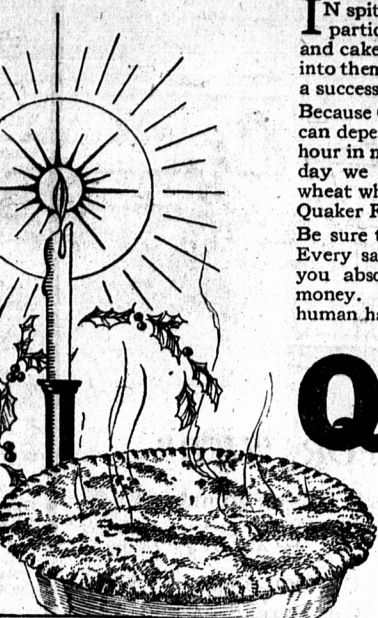
