**N. Y. Stock Prices In Best Advance For Weeks**

NEW YORK, Feb. 28—(AP)—With a last minute buying surge the stock market today moved ahead in its sharpest advance in more than seven weeks.  
Gains were from fractions to more than a point with the increases spread generously through most of the major groups in the list.  
The forward movement got underway with the opening of the market, slowed down at mid-day, and then started up again toward the close. The late trading sent most prices up to their top for the day.  
The total volume was 740,000 shares with 230,000 shares traded in the last hour.  
Ralls and steel shares were the leaders on the initial rise. The oil group, after lagging behind, came through with a rush near the close with substantial gains.

At Toronto  
TORONTO, Feb. 28—(CP)—Prices climbed slowly upwards for the first time in more than a week on the Toronto Stock Exchange today. Western oils showed the sharpest improvement as key issues moved strongly in moderately active trading.  
Base metals were well ahead in early dealings but tended to sag from their advances towards the close. Golds were practically ignored with a few issues weakening slightly.  
Gains ranged up to 30 cents in key western oils. Royalty climbed to \$6.20, partially recovering some of last week's losses and Anglo-Canadian was ahead 25 cents at \$31.0. Calgary and Edmonton and Pacific Petroleum were also good gainers.

At Montreal  
MONTREAL, Feb. 28—(CP)—Securities and mines were slowly rallying last week's losses in dull trading on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market today, reflecting a similar movement started on Wall Street Saturday.  
Minor gains predominated in papers, utilities, metals, western oils, beverages and mines. Senior oils were slow and slightly easier.  
Price changes generally were fractional, but a few leaders advanced as much as two points.  
Industrials were traded on a total of 21,700 shares, a drop of 18,100 shares from Friday. Mining turnover was 111,800 shares against 136,600 Friday.  
Of 116 issues traded; 58 were higher, 39 lower and 63 unchanged. Two new highs and 18 new lows were established.  
Closing averages indicated banks off .13 at a new low of 27.22. Industrials gained .6, papers 4.04, golds .11 and utilities remained unchanged at 70.2.  
Consolidated Smelters and Aluminum jumped one point each to 102 and 53, respectively in metals. Hudson Bay Mining and Noranda added 1-2 each and International Nickel was up 1-4. United Steel was quiet but rose 1-4 at 6 3-4. Atlas Steel was unchanged at 11 points.
