GLACE BAY, Dec. 20.—Unless the town of Glace Bay hands down increases of 55 cents a day to all members of the American Federation of Labor employed by the town, we are going to make application for a board of arbitration, and in the event of said board not granting the increases asked for, we are going to quit work in a body until such time as our demands are met.

The above were the statements made by a member of the Federation here yesterday. The central labor union affiliated with the Federation of Labor, which includes all members of the town staff, about fifty in number, exclusive of the police department, at the time the miners asked for the increase of one dollar a day, made similar demands on the town.

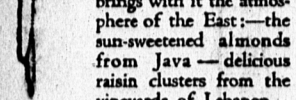

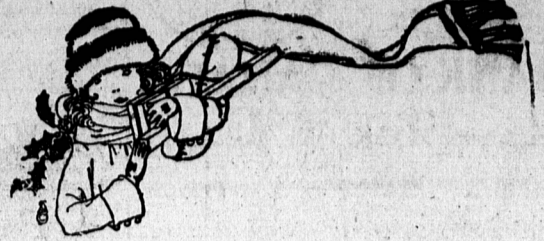
