PLANS TO REFORM THE HOUSE OF LORDS.

All parties in the United Kingdom are now committed to either limit the powers of the House of Lords, or to entirely alter its constitution. It will be of interest to bring together the several plans for the purpose of comparison. First it is to be noted that the proposals of the Asquith Government as embodied in the resolutions passed through the House of Commons recently do not touch the question of membership, or the right of hereditary succession at all. These proposals simply deal with the veto power of the Lords, and would deprive them from rejecting money bills, or from preventing the ultimate enactment of any bill twice passed in successive years by the Commons.

Mr. Balfour, leader of the Unionist Opposition, has summed up his views in regard to the Lords as follows:

- 1. A Second Chamber is necessary. 2. It must be a real Chamber. 3. The House of Commons must remain the dominating Chamber. 4. The reform of the Second Chamber should be grafted upon the present House of Lords. 5. The hereditary right to sit in the Second Chamber must go. 6. The Second Chamber must be greatly diminished in numbers. 7. It must include persons who are qualified by distinguished public service. 8. A section of it must be elected by the Peers. 9. At least half must come from outside.

Lord Rosebery, Liberal and an effeminate, now occupying an independent position, embodied his views in a resolution which was passed by the House of Lords a few weeks ago as follows:

That in future the House of Lords shall consist of Lords of Parliament: (a) chosen by the whole body of hereditary Peers from among themselves and by nomination by the Crown; (b) sitting by virtue of offices and of qualifications held by them; (c) chosen from outside.

Lord Lansdowne, Conservative, discussing in his place the Government proposals in regard to the Lords, The estimates have been submitted to the Canadian Parliament, providing for a total expenditure of \$138,863,200. This is the biggest figure yet, and there are supplementaries yet to come. But there is this to be said—every year we have a greater Canada.

made some important admissions:

"There are certain points in the Bill which would obtain a very general measure of adhesion from all political parties in this House," he said. "It affirms, directly or indirectly, four propositions:—

- 1. That there is a need of regulating the relations between the two Houses.—I do not think anybody would contest that. 2. That it is desirable that the House of Lords should be reformed.—We at any rate are not likely to differ from that proposition. 3. The claim that the House of Commons is entitled to preponderance in all cases where purely financial considerations are involved.—If that is interpreted in a reasonable manner, I for one should certainly not quarrel with that claim. 4. The principle that it is necessary to provide us with some machinery at present non-existent to relieve the two Houses should there come to be serious differences of opinion between them."

He proceeded to state that the Lords would be prepared to forego their constitutional right to reject money bills of a purely financial character with nothing of another nature tacked to them. If any question arose as to any bill he would have it referred to a joint sitting of both Houses with the Speaker of the Commons presiding.

This epitome of the views of the leaders of both parties makes it clear that the House of Lords as it has been known for hundreds of years has already practically ceased to exist; that it is to be constituted anew, with probably much diminished numbers and considerably limited powers, and with the right of hereditary succession wholly eliminated. Both parties being so extensively committed, a great reform in the ancient Upper House seems inevitable however the present election may turn, but, of course, the nature and extent of the changes must depend upon which party is successful at the polls. In any case the outcome will mark the present election as a historic one in the annals of parliamentary government.

They call it an election that is going on in England just now. But it is fraught with changes that amount to a revolution, and could only be effected in many countries by armed force.

The new lobster regulations proposed at Ottawa would, if carried into effect prove a great hardship to those engaged in this industry in P. E. Island. Their remonstrances, voiced by our representatives at Ottawa, ought to command the serious attention of the Fisheries Department and the Government. It surely ought to be possible to protect the lobster fishery without ruining those who are engaged in it, and we trust a way may be found to do this.
