## ETHEL BARRYMORE SECRETLY MARRIED

BOSTON, Mass., March 20.—True to the family bent of doing things out of the customary way, Miss Ethel Barrymore and Russell Groswood Colt were married at half-past nine o'clock in the rectory of St. Mary's Church, at Hyde Park, Sunday morning, and succeeded in keeping the public in ignorance of the event until Wednesday. After the announcement of the engagement of the actress and the son of Colonel Samuel P. Colt, of Providence, many statements were made about the wedding, and one, which was given out with the authority of Miss Barrymore and Mr. Colt, it was said, stated the wedding would take place in New York during the week of April 4. The formal announcement was made by her manager at the Hollis Street Theatre, where Miss Barrymore is appearing in "Lady Frederick."

The Rev. Father Chittick officiated at the ceremony, and the marriage was formally witnessed by John Barrymore, brother of the bride who came from New York for the event, and Roswell Colt, brother of the bridegroom. Several Church dispensations were necessary, as Mr. Colt is not a Roman Catholic, his bride is a resident of another diocese and as it is not the custom of the Church to marry in Lent.

Preceding their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Colt passed Sunday as guests of John and Mrs. Fairchild, in Dedham.

## LORD BURTON'S HEART REMOVED

LONDON, March 20.—The will of the late Lord Burton shows that the gross value of the estate registered at the principal probate registry is £1,000,000 at least, as far as at present can be ascertained.

After naming executors the will directs that "before my body be placed in the coffin the spine and spinal marrow by a competent surgeon, and my heart removed and placed in a separate vessel to be enclosed in the coffin."

## ITALY A BAD PLACE FOR MR. ROOSEVELT

NEW YORK, March 22.—The World prints this cablegram from London, which was written by the London Chronicle's correspondent at Milan:

"The Italian police are in a state of trepidation over Mr. Roosevelt's arrival in Naples early in April, and learn with dismay that the ex-president's wife and three children intend to sojourn in Southern Italy until June. Every effort will be made to dissuade Mr. Roosevelt from setting foot in Sicily and the earthquake region.

The Messina district from time immemorial, has been the stronghold of the Mafia and in view of the ex-president's strenuous campaign against secret criminal associations, such a movement would be attended with grave results."

**ORDNANCE STATIONS IN CANADA.**

OTTAWA, March 22.—Militia general orders announce that ordnance stations in Canada are re-classified as follows:

First Class—Halifax, Ottawa, Quebec and Toronto.

Second Class—Montreal, Kingston, Esquimaux and Winnipeg.

Third Class—Calgary, St. John, London and Charlottetown.

Officers of the Canadian Ordnance Corps are classified as first class, second class and third class ordnance officers, and will, as far as possible, be posted to stations accordingly.

## LOCAL OPTION TEMPERANCE LAW

ST. JOHN, March 21.—In the legislature today Premier Hazen said it was intended to amend the liquor license law by providing that a vote on local option may be taken in any city or municipality on the application of one-quarter of the taxpayers and a majority of the votes cast will decide the issue. If against the saloon the vote shall be made effective the following year. It is also provided that the vote shall be taken on the day of municipal election day. Under the present law a minority of the votes on the list must be given before the saloon can be made illegal. Mr. Hazen said there would be other amendments but he did not name them.

He said it was also proposed to appoint a medical commission to enquire into the preventing of tuberculosis. Two free sites for a sanitarium have been offered.

**FINANCIAL LOSS IS HEAVY.**

BOSTON, March 22.—Two hundred and twenty-one persons perished by shipwreck and eighty-nine vessels met disaster off the New England and the British North American coasts, or while engaged in the New England or Canadian trade during the fall and winter season of 1908-09, which ended last night.

Of the eighty-nine vessels cast ashore or lost at sea, six steamers and fifty-six sailing vessels were totally wrecked. The financial loss exceeds three million dollars.

## STREET CARS FOR MONCTON

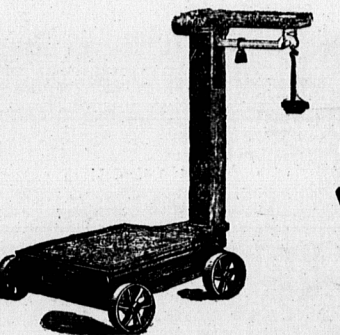
MONCTON, Mar. 20.—The committee representing the city council and representatives of the Moncton Street Railway Company tonight practically agreed on all important points of difference in reference to the charter to be asked for by the company at the coming session of the legislature. It was agreed that for the first twenty years the company pay no revenue to the city, the next ten years the company pay one per cent. on gross earnings and the next forty years two per cent.

The company is to complete the road three years from the day of charter. The question of the city taking over the road at the expiration of forty years was not considered.

## CITY OF HALIFAX LOSES ITS SUIT

HALIFAX, March 20.—The city of Halifax must pay the full amount of the Neptune Water Meter Company's bill and costs of the action brought by the company. This at least is the effect of the decision handed down by Judge Lawrence today. His lordship has decided that the fourteen hundred meters stored on the Plant line wharf are the property of the city and that the city must pay for the whole 2,100 contracted for. The company's bill is \$18,355 and the expenses of the suit will amount to eight or nine hundred dollars more.
