MACARONI AND CHEESE

One cup of macaroni broken in one-inch pieces, two quarts boiling water, two teaspoonfuls of salt. Cook the macaroni in boiling salted water until tender (twenty minutes). Drain in a strainer and then pour cold water over the macaroni to prevent the pieces from sticking together. Put a layer of the macaroni in bottom of buttered baking dish, sprinkle with grated cheese and one teaspoonful mustard, then repeat with a layer of macaroni and cheese and mustard until all is used. Cover this with milk and then cover the top with buttered bread crumbs and bake in a moderate oven until crumbs are brown (twenty minutes).

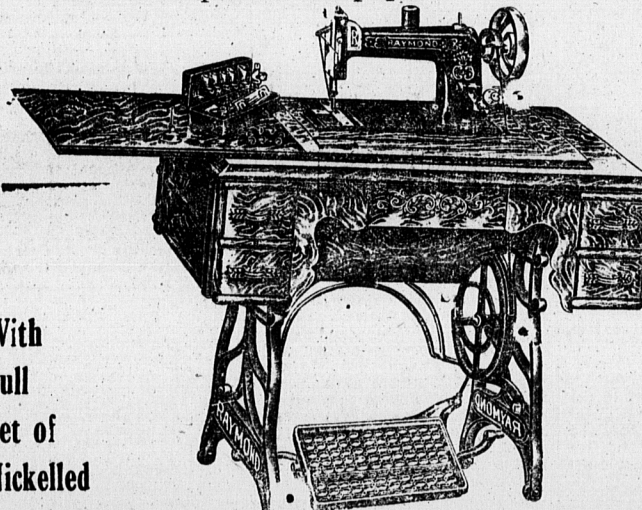
