APPOINTMENTS AND EXPERIMENTAL FARM

A meeting of the Provincial Government was held on Friday. The following routine matters were disposed of: The three sheriffs were re-appointed, also E. O. Nash of Charlottetown and E. H. Wright, of Summerside, school trustees. The following additional members were appointed on the Montague Board of Health—Dr. D. R. Fraser, John McLean, Montague, and L. B. Aitken of Lower Montague, John T. Dawson of North Tryon was appointed a Road Inspector for District No. 19. B. Connolly of St. John's Road and Calvin D. McCallum of Souris were appointed Commissioners of Deeds for King's County. Major C. Murray of Bradalbane, William Thompson of McNeill's Mills, and John J. Chaisson of St. Louis, were appointed Justices of the Peace. Matters pertaining to the Stock Farm and the new Experimental Farm were considered and some details worked out. The live stock and so much of the land of the Stock Farm as is not needed for the Insane Hospital

and Infirmary will be sold at an early day. As to the Experimental Farm an arrangement is entered into by which the purchase of the property before described on Mount Edward Road will be completed. The land will be conveyed to the Provincial Government, but the Federal Government is to pay at the rate of \$50 per acre toward the purchase price and take a lease for 99 years from the Province, conditioned upon the land being continuously utilized for an experimental farm. Failing this the property will revert to the Province. The Dominion will erect the necessary buildings, place a superintendent in charge and carry on the operations of the Farm.

COLD SHOULDER FOR REPORTER

SAN FRANCISCO, May 29.—Baron Oskar Rothschild, youngest son of Baron Albert Rothschild, head of the Vienna branch of the family, is in San Francisco on his way to Vancouver and the Rocky mountains to hunt grizzly bears.

The young baron has supreme contempt for the press and is not backward about his expression of it. He was approached by a reporter on the Nippon Maru late recently and in reply to a question, said:

"Yes I speak English to my friends. Who are you?"
When informed, the baron, who is but 20 years old, turned his back upon the reporter and said:

General Ashton, of Tacoma, who accompanied Moreton Frewen to Prince Rupert, is a firm believer in the future of the town. 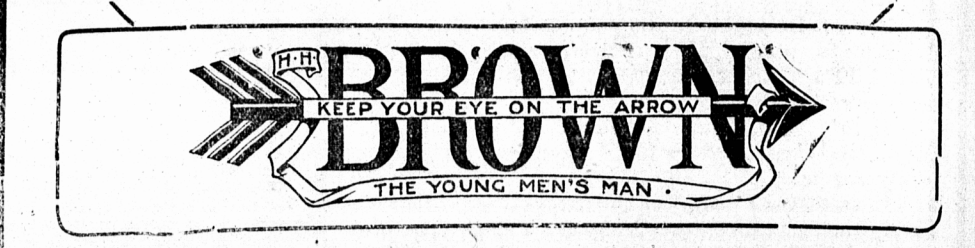
