HON. A. J. MATHESON SERIOUSLY ILL.  
TORONTO, March 5—Hon. A. J. Matheson, provincial treasurer, is reported to be in a more serious condition of illness than the information thus far given out would indicate. Under the most favorable circumstances, he may be unable to enter the office again for three or four weeks if indeed again this season.

H. W. BOTTOMLEY ILL. HEARING POSTPONED.  
LONDON, March 5—On account of the illness of the litigant, the examination of Horatio W. Bottomley, member of Parliament, lawyer, editor and daring promoter, who was recently condemned to pay \$250,000 damages to the estate of the late R. E. Master, was postponed in bankruptcy court today. Bottomley was accused last year of obtaining \$285,000 from the Master estate, through a stock promoting enterprise. He sought refuge in bankruptcy.

ENGLAND MAY NEED CANADIAN COAL.  
HALIFAX, March 5—It is understood that private cables received from London during the past day or two intimate the possible purchase of coal from Nova Scotia collieries, provided the strike trouble in England should continue for an indefinite period.  
It is only natural that large consumers of coal in the British Isles should be anxious to provide for future supplies of coal, and it is not surprising that inquiry should be made on this side of the Atlantic.  
Representatives of the big coal companies in the Maritime Provinces are reluctant to discuss the situation, as they state that they have received no direct demands or inquiries for Nova Scotia coal for shipment to England, and until such an occasion actually appears they have nothing to say as regards the English outlook.  
On the other hand, it is believed that should a demand for coal be received the miners throughout the province might refuse to mine for shipment to English ports, considering the situation as it now exists in England.  
Reports from London and Liverpool state that should American or Canadian coal be shipped to England, the wharf laborers at British ports would refuse to handle it.  
However, it is likely that more trans-Atlantic liners will coal on this side of the Atlantic than has been the custom, so as to avoid any inconvenience in obtaining fuel on the other side.

CAMPBELLITES PLAN TO WORK FOR CHAMP CLARK.  
CHICAGO, March 5—A flying squadron of Campbellite preachers will invade Kansas next Thursday to work at the State wide primary for the election of a solid delegation of Democrats pledged to support Champ Clark for President at the Democratic National Convention.

REFUSE TO RAISE WAGES OF MINERS.  
NEW YORK, March 5—Previous to the meeting of the anthracite operators at No. 145 Liberty street today it was announced that the mine owners would issue an ultimatum to the men declining to grant a 20 per cent. increase, the chief demand of the miners.
