Road Convention

Dates Announced

MONTREAL, July 16—The twenty-third annual convention of the Canadian Good Roads Association, to be held September 7, 8, and 9, at the Algonquin Hotel, St. Andrews-by-the-Sea, N.B., will be formally opened by Colonel the Honourable Murray MacLaren, C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick, while official welcomes will be extended by Premier A. A. Dwyer, on behalf of the provincial Government, and by Mayor H. B. Hachey on behalf of the town of St. Andrews.

The chief presiding officer of the convention will be Hon. A. S. MacMillan, Minister of Highways for Nova Scotia and president of the association, and prominent among those who are expected to take leading parts in the proceedings are the first vice-president, Hon. F. M. MacPherson, Minister of Public Works, British Columbia; the second vice-president, Hon. T. B. McClelland, Minister of Highways, Ontario, and the third vice-president, Hon. Francois J. Leduc, Minister of Highways, Quebec. These ministers will be accompanied by their deputies, chief engineers or other departmental aides, and officials of similar rank will represent the other provinces and Canada. A representative of the British Ministry of Transport has accepted an invitation to be present and address the convention, and officials of the United States Department of Roads at Washington are also expected to take part in the discussions. There will be five business sessions in the course of the three days of the convention, and the programme, though still incomplete, is already considered one of the best-balanced and most comprehensive in the history of the association.
