MEMORIAL OF THE STATE COURT TO THE MEMORY OF PAULINUS MCDONALD.

"This ever young to say a good man dies and no one will ever say or feel that Paulinus McDonald has left this world or any other world. His culture, his scholarship, his dignity, his poetic temperament, his fraternal heart are with us today and will last long in memory, and after we are gone there will be vibrations of his great soul because of the great work he did. To have come within the radius of his classic diction and literary dignity was to stand within the presence of a soul of whom Deity might well say: 'This is a son of mine.' To have known Paulinus McDonald was more than a privilege; it was an inspiration. To have met the genial generous personality and dignity of Mr. McDonald was to have felt the impulse to uncover in the presence of a master mind. And when we turn to the pages recording the achievements of fraternalism in the Catholic order of Foresters, we find a conspicuous chapter heading in the name of Paulinus McDonald.

What higher tribute can close the chapter of this man's history than to say: "His life was gentle, and the elements so mixed in him. That nature might stand up And say to all the world This was a man."

IN MEMORIAM

JOHN CLORY.

Mr. John Clory, son of Captain Charles Clory of Georgetown died on Friday the 12th inst. at the comparatively early age of twenty-eight. Deceased had been ailing for a long time and his illness finally developed into consumption. Since new years he had been practically confined to his bed and despite all the loving care of his family and the best medical attention could do for him he gradually sank and on Friday of last week he passed away in the presence of his grief-stricken parents and the other members of his family. Church on Sunday Roman Catholic. The funeral on Sunday was largely attended. The services in the church and at the grave were performed by Rev. D. P. Croken. Deceased leaves to mourn a sorrowing father and mother, several brothers and one sister Mrs. Joseph Currie of Georgetown, and a large circle of friends and acquaintances. May his soul rest in peace.

PAULINUS MCDONALD.

The death occurred at Portland, Oregon, on April 7th 1916 after a painful and protracted illness which he bore with Christian patience and resignation to thy Divine Will. Paulinus McDonald, a native of Lot 10 Prince Co. Prince Edward Island, where he was born forty-nine years ago. After attending the district school of that place for some years he came to Summerside High School where he continued until he qualified for a teacher, which profession he followed for some time. Not finding the business of a teacher remunerative he engaged in the fresh fish trade and store keeping. Fifteen years ago he moved with his family to the Pacific Coast and located in Portland, Oregon, where he remained until his death.

After settling in Portland, he edited the "Portland Labor Press" for some years when he was appointed Principal of the Hoffman High School, a position which he held until his last illness.

The deceased was a man of exceedingly bright parts, in the full prime of manhood, in the midst of a life of energy, with his mind alert with ambition, a great intellect is still. Four brothers and four sisters survive him, one of the latter a nun at present in the Convent of Notre Dame, Charlottetown. Beside his disconsolate wife he leaves to mourn their loss, three daughters and two sons. His funeral took place on the 10th inst. when his remains were followed from his late residence to the Pro Cathedral, by a large procession of friends and well wishers desirous of paying the last tribute of respect to his memory. A solemn Mass of Requiem with deacon and sub deacon was offered for the repose of his soul, after which all that was mortal of Paulinus McDonald was laid to rest on Calvary hill.—R. I. P.

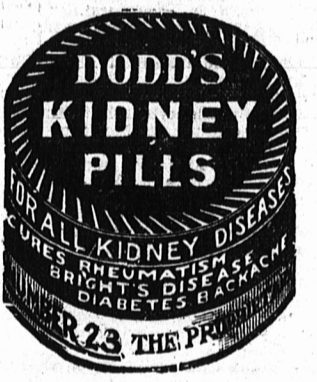

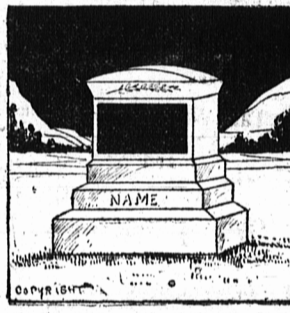

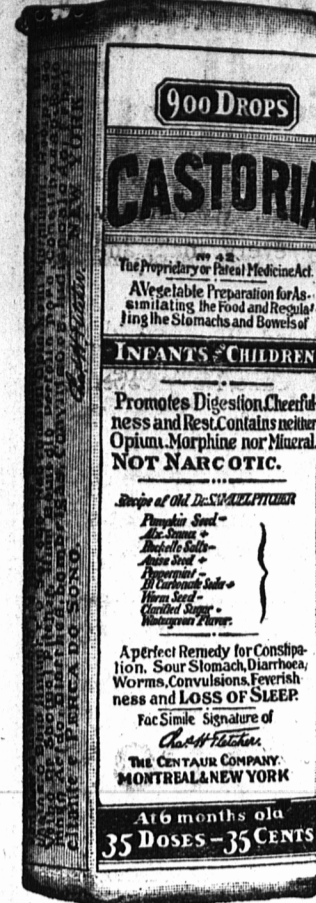
