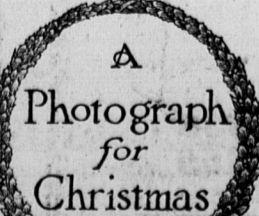

Notes By the Way

Hon. H. A. McKown, speaking before the Vancouver Board of Trade, laid down three important principles which in his opinion ought to govern the solution of Canadian transportation problems.

Briefly summarized the Chairman of the Board of Railway Commissioners laid down the following three points:

First, that where equal conditions obtain there shall be no discrimination in freight rates.

Second, that the flow of Canadian wheat through United States ports must cease.

It may be doubted whether the Railway Commission has power to determine that Canadian wheat shall be shipped only through Canadian ports, however desirable that might be.

It is to be borne in mind also in regard to wheat shipments through American ports that practice has been permitted under both Liberal and Conservative Governments in the past.

In the last analysis, the fruition of the Railway Commission's decisions and recommendations will depend upon what measures to that end, or contrary thereto will be advised by the Government and sanctioned by Parliament.

That Body of Yours. By James W. Barton, M.D. TIREDDNESS AND AIR

Perhaps you wonder why your physician advocates the fresh air for you in sickness or in health.

Now what has air—oxygen—do with this? Why the oxygen combines with this poison and makes a gas which you get rid of by breathing.

But you see if you are not where the air is fresh, then enough oxygen does not get into the blood, and thence to the muscle to mix with or take up this poison.

In any case there has accumulated in your muscles what is called fatigue products or fatigue substances.

If you were to sit out doors or go where the ventilation was unusually good, these products would mix with the oxygen coming into your lungs, and then be carried out again by the very act of breathing.

To the Fox Breeders

Fox breeders who intend pelting foxes for fur this season would be well advised to prepare their skins in the best condition possible so as to command top prices.

Some breeders are now beginning to pelt their foxes. This is not in the best interests of the fur trade or fox industry. Quite a number of pelts have already been offered for sale.

The skin shows a blue or dark appearance instead of being white. In an underprime skin the guard fur is not properly secured to the pelt and consequently the skin will not dress when in the hands of the fur dresser.

Many fox breeders say that their foxes go overprime in color and that they rub; both these conditions can be overcome by careful feeding and a little extra attention to housing.

Do not overfeed foxes that are to be pelted; just sufficient food to maintain health, and avoid too much fatty soft foods with vegetables preferred and just a small portion of meat.

When the pioneers of this great industry, Sir Charles Dalton and the late Mr. Robert Oulton were marketing pelts they realized good prices, and their furs were looked upon by furriers as perfect specimens and excellent color.

If your foxes are good take the best of care of the pelts and wait until nature season primes your furs. Poor foxes can be killed any time, but by all means do not kill your good foxes for fur until they are prime.

This industry is worth many thousands of dollars to this province. It can be made much more valuable in the future. Let all endeavor to make our furs the attraction of the fur trade that they have been.

There is no doubt some people are of the opinion that the furs lose in color, but watch your feeding and your fox pelt should gain in color as well as in length of fur.

This information is passed on to the breeders from facts gathered from marketing of Silver Fox fur and from remarks of the great fur dealers in Silver Fox furs with the hope that it may be of some benefit and assistance to our fox breeders.
