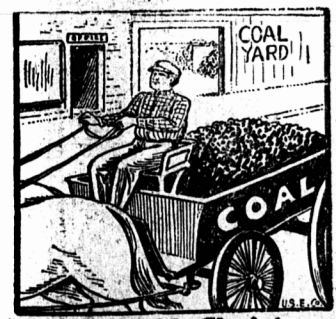

MARKET PRICES.—The following prices were secured on the Charlottetown market square Tuesday and have prevailed since last Friday:—White Oats, 38 to 42c; black oats 40 to 42c; potatoes 25 to 30c; beef (quarter) per lb, 7 to 8c; beef (small) per lb, 10 to 16c. The prices quoted by the wholesalers are:—Potatoes 25 to 38c; hay 70 to 75c; white oats, 38 to 42c; black oats, 40 to 42c; straw, \$5.50 to \$6.50.

CHRISTMAS TREE.—The annual Xmas tree of Bethel School was held Dec. 23rd at seven o'clock. The gathering was called to order, Lincoln Wood acting as chairman. After a short program by the pupils and others, Santa Claus appeared on the scene to distribute the gifts which were numerous. After singing the National Anthem the merry crowd dispersed to their homes well pleased with the evening's entertainment.
