CAPT READ'S AMENDMENT.

We do not suppose that any Legislature in this world, and certainly not the Legislature of Prince Edward would pass the amendment proposed by Capt Read to the City Lighting Bill. And we do not hold Capt. Read responsible for its phraseology, and we assume, whether rightly or wrongly, that the amendment has been drawn by more interested parties and placed in his hands.

The first and second clauses are open to serious objections. The first clause is not quite intelligible, but it seems to forbid the city levying rates or constructing electric light works until it has first by bylaw fixed a price for the present lighting plant and notified the Company of the same, or until the Company has accepted such price and the money has been paid, or until the Company has appointed an arbitrator, and so on. But as there is nothing to compel the Company to appoint such arbitrator, or to enable the City to proceed without such appointment being made, the Company might simply let matters go, neither accepting the price offered nor appointing an arbitrator, and the city could not proceed a single step further. It would be simply "held up."

The second clause provides that the arbitrators, when appointed shall determine the value of the Light and Power Company's works, "having regard to what the same works would cost if the works should be then constructed on the property then bought, and such amount so ascertained shall be the amount which the arbitrators shall award as the price to be allowed for the said works and property." This clause is, as we have said, too absurd to be seriously entertained by a body of honest legislators. It simply provides that the Company shall be paid for their old plant and works what it would cost to replace the same with new works! Surely we have not yet come to a stage where such a proposal can be seriously considered by level-headed, honest men.

A Souris merchant mentioned at Thursday evening's meeting that he had only recently received a car-load of flour ordered in November last and which came to hand five months after date of shipment from Ontario. Persons in this city and in various parts of the Province are now receiving goods which have been at Pictou three months or more. This sort of thing is helping to give an impetus to the Tunnel movement.

The meeting at Souris on Thursday evening to hear the report of the Ottawa delegates was a very hearty and promising one. Mr. McQuarrie, E.C. was unable to attend, being otherwise occupied by an urgent professional engagement, much to the regret of his co-delegates and those who attended the meeting. A pleasing feature was the attendance of a goodly company of the ladies of Souris, who listened with the same earnest attention as their masculine friends. If the Souris meeting affords any fair test of the feeling in King's County, it is now evident that the eastern section of the Province is quite as hearty in its support of the Tunnel as are the people of the centre or the west. In fact the movement is now beyond question thoroughly provincial and is everywhere growing in strength and volume.

PROHIBITION AMENDMENTS.

Both the Ministerial and Opposition sides of the House are to be heartily commended for the support given to the main features of the amendments to the Prohibitory Liquor Law as asked for. The provisions to render the search warrant clause effective, and to compel the testimony of persons arrested for drunkenness as to where they obtained their liquor, must be of great service in securing the easier and better enforcement of the law in the future.

We have grave doubts however in regard to the following new provision: Nothing in this Act contained shall prohibit the sale by legally qualified chemists and druggists of drugs or medicines mixed with alcohol or spirituous liquors for purely medicinal purposes.

Whether standing alone, or read in connection with the amendments to subsection four of section 4, which restricts druggists to sell only on a physician's prescription, this clause seems capable of an interpretation that might prove highly detrimental to the main purpose of the law.
