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Give Sugar Sack a Rest; Potatoes or Cereals Can Provide the Calories

NEW DARNING THREAD Women who want to get as much wear as possible out of nylon stockings will be glad to know that a nylon darning thread has been developed and is now available in ten hosiery colours. It is said to be especially strong and resistant to abrasion.

CARAMEL TIP When making caramels cook the mixture in a very heavy utensil over a low flame and stir constantly. This will prevent curdling as well as burning.

QUICK APPLESAUCE If you like a smooth applesauce, cut the apples, unpeeled, in quarters or eighths, remove cores, cook until tender, then strain. Add sugar while the sauce is still hot.

CANDY TIP Tonings or candies will not sugar so readily if the pan is well covered during the cooking process.

LUNCH Casserole of Lima Beans Stewed Tomatoes Celery "Honey Butter Tarts" Tea Coffee Milk

DINNER Roast of Beef Browned Potatoes Buttered Carrots "Maple Blanc Mange" Tea Coffee

HONEY BUTTER TARTS 1-2 cup butter 1-2 cup honey 1-2 cup currants 1 tablespoon milk 1 teaspoon vanilla Pastry Mix the butter, honey, milk and eggs and beat until smooth; add the currants and flavoring. Bake in lined pastry shells in a fairly hot oven for about 15 minutes. (temperature 450 F.) for first five minutes then slower to complete baking.)

MAPLE BLANC MANGE 3 tablespoonful of corn starch 1-4 teaspoonful of salt 1-2 cupful of milk 1-2 cupful of maple syrup 1 egg 1-3 cupful of chopped walnuts 1-4 teaspoonful of salt Mix the corn starch with 1-4 cupful of the cold milk. Heat the remainder 1-4 cupful in a saucepan and add to the corn starch, stirring constantly. Return to the saucepan and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until thick. Add the beaten egg and walnuts, and serve with cream or whipped cream.

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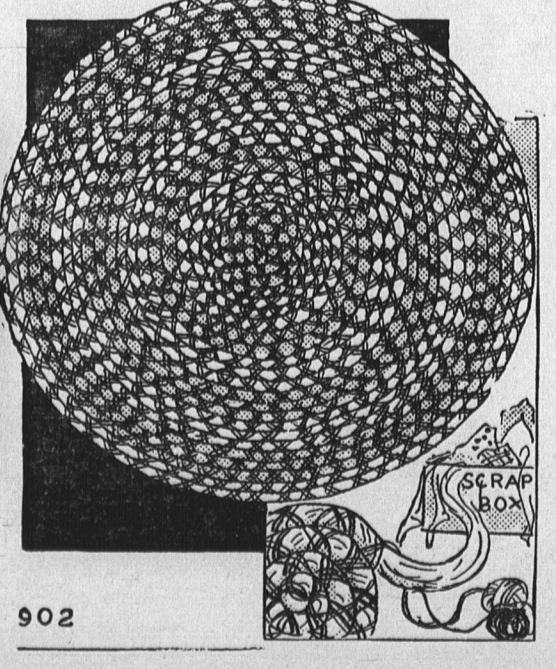
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CROCHET A ROUND RUG FROM YOUR SCRAP BAG
