TEMPTING MEN TO THE CHURCH

Pointers at Adult Bible Conference—Spittoons in Gallery Speaker Says Women Cause Friction in the Mixed Classes.

TORONTO, Feb. 3.—Women have their own particular effect even in adult Bible classes, according to W. C. Pearce of Chicago, who addressed the adult Bible class conference, held at the Metropolitan church this morning. Mr. Pearce is superintendent of the adult department of the International Sunday School association.

"Business men and men of all kinds are conditions go on well together," said Mr. Pearce. "A large class composed of all harmony and concord. But these men bring their lives to the class, and several distinct lines will appear, and you will keep them out."

Mr. Pearce advocates separate classes for men and women. He told of a church in a little town in the south where spittoons were kept in the gallery, which was always well filled with men.

They got me into church every Sunday who wouldn't have come unless they could chew tobacco and spit, said Mr. Pearce.

But we are after men—tobacco and all. We must get them into church in order to convert them. So let us get them in regardless. We should look through a dirty or drunken exterior, into the soul beneath. That's what we're after. Many a dirty man has been cleaned up in a week. Mr. Pearce's remarks were followed by a general discussion, in which he led.

The ways and means of organizing adult Bible classes, the social side, and the officers necessary, were discussed pro and con by the sixty odd delegates.

The meeting was in favor of not allowing boys under sixteen in men's classes except under special circumstances and the delegates seemed to favor separate classes.

Once a pastor said to me Mr. Pearce remarked, let the young men and women meet, fall in love, and get married, all under the auspices of Christ's church.

This argument, however, did not turn the apparent feeling in favor of mixed classes. Mr. Pearce related the duties of each officer from teacher and president down to the treasurer, and offered to answer any questions that would help the delegates.

About 60 representatives of Sunday schools from all over Ontario attended this morning's meeting, many being Torontonians. The discussion was continued this afternoon, and this evening at Chalmers' church. The conference will be addressed by Mrs. Conant Patterson, of Chicago, on How a Women's Class Converts.

Marshall A. Hudson, of Syracuse, leader of the Barons movement, will speak on Methods of Securing Pew Members at tomorrow's meeting at the Metropolitan church. Justice MacLaren will preside at the devotional service at the Metropolitan church tomorrow evening.

PROPER SORT OF LOAF OF BREAD

The Question Which Was Hard To Decide In London Competition

LONDON, Feb. 3.—What is the ideal loaf? An attempt to answer this question was made recently by the holding of a bread championship competition in the offices of the Baker and Confectioner. Selected candidates who had won thrice in monthly competitions each sent in three half-quart loaves of three recognized shapes—the "Coburg," of the mole-hill pattern; the "crusty cottage," of the two spheres, and the "tin loaf," the silver challenge bowl went to a Leeds baker.

The point of a prize loaf in the competition was the most pleasant savored loaf, but it is too yellow for the public and the prize ring. A blend of the flours of the world is preferred, but it is now recognized that English milling is the best in the world, and is now well on the way to defeat American competition.

Partly as a result of this competition, the controversy as to the merits of brown and white bread has become acute. The best three loaves in the competition were pure white, but failed because they were "faked" with milk, which is not allowed, although milk bread is the best.

A noted man of science asserts that home-made bread is inferior to baker's bread, and that brown bread gives less nutriment, under the handicap of the human digestion, than white.

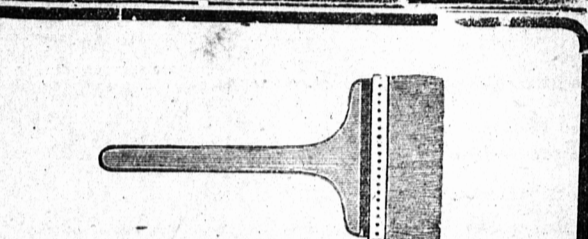
