CANNOT TAKE THE PROPERTY OF THE SPIRIT WRESTLERS

Doukhobor Women Saved Their Stock — Bailiff and His Party Attacked By Female Furies Armed With Pitchforks

St. John's, March 22. D. L. H. has reached here of Bailiff Walter K. Scott's unsuccessful attempt to seize the chattels of the Doukhobors for taxes a few days ago near Yorkton.

Armed with the warrants of seizure Mr. Scott and assistants went to the village of Kariluke. This village is located on the line of the Canadian Northern Railway three miles west of Buchanan. Their visits were unexpected by the Doukhobors, and, before being molested, they effected the removal of forty head of mixed cattle, fifty-two sheep, and one mare and colt. The mare and colt broke away, and ran to the village, where they were taken in charge by the Doukhobors.

Mr. Scott had made arrangements to have the sheep and cattle taken care of at Buchanan, and drove there, but was astonished on their arrival to find the Doukhobors awaiting them. The Doukhobors immediately commenced an attack on the officials with clubs and the small party of four was soon overpowered. Mr. Scott endeavored to persuade one Jim Simeroff and Peter Verge, who is known as the King of the village, to sign an agreement to the effect that they would allow them to retain all the stock seized. A member of the Doukhobor party stated that Verge would not allow them to take a pen or pencil of any description in their hands to make mark of any kind. They wanted to know what the officers wanted with

the stock, and Mr. Scott produced his warrants a second time. They then directed Mr. Scott to go to Verge, which, of course, was useless.

Later in the evening Jim Simeroff and others made a promise to Mr. Scott that everything would be all right. Before leaving, three additional teams of horse, with all traps and harness, and also a pair of oxen were seized.

During the adventurous trip of Mr. Scott and his twenty-four deputies into the Kariluke village of the Doukhobor district, they encountered the women who fought like demons. One of the men were knocked down and kicked very severely. When Mr. Scott was taking a horse from a stable he was encircled by a party armed with pitchforks, clubs, and other weapons, and he was lucky to escape without serious injury. An informant was said against two of the se-alleants. When the police went to serve the warrants the men showed greatest humility. Then another attempt was made to seize the cattle, but the women once more intervened, and again saved their stock and all that could be taken away was one colt.

FIGHTING AGAINST CHILD LABOR

New York, March 22. At a meeting held in this city yesterday it was announced that arrangements are being made for the formation of a permanent organization for the abolition of child labor. Mrs. Anna Garlin Spencer, who presided, was assisted by Mrs. Pauline Goldman of the Consumers' League. Among the speakers were Bishop Potter, Murray Williams, chairman of the New York Child Labor Committee; Dr. Felix Alder, and Major Alfred Calhoun. The representatives of several labor unions were present. Bishop Potter who was the first speaker, said that the movement was a national one and he expressed the hope that the organization would succeed in arousing public sentiment, without which, he said, legislation would be of no use. Mr. Williams commended the anti-child labor bill of Senator Page, and urged those present to write asking their respective Assembly-men to vote for it.
