S. D. C. AGAIN WINS FROM P. W. C. TEAM

No. 7247 shows a smart little blouse with the back cut with an extension that gives the effect of a small shoulder yoke. Yokes are very modish and the set-in sleeve vies with the drop-shoulder and raglan design for popularity.

This design is especially suited to linen, one of the heavier cotton weaves or a heavy serge. Natural pique is an excellent material for a plain blouse of this kind and if desired a touch of embroidery or a bright contrasting silk may be used for the collar and cuffs with pleasing effect. Pongee washes well and wears excellently. It averages 36 inches in width and may be purchased from 50 cents a yard up.

Hooks and eyes or a line of novelty buttons, a washable kind, may be used to close the blouse. Very often the home dressmaker finds herself inconvenienced by a lack of sizes in her book and eye box. Instead of buying one size of black or white hooks and eyes it is economical to purchase a card of every size from the smallest to the largest dress hook and keep them on hand. An assortment of snap fasteners will also be found very handy at times.

This blouse may be made in size 38 with 2 1/4 yards of 36 inch material. The pattern is cut in 6 sizes: 32 to 40.

ALSATIAN ARRIVES WITH WRECKED MEN

(Canadian Press.) HALIFAX, Feb. 23.—The mail steamer Alsatian arrived here today after a stormy trip from Liverpool and landed 553 passengers, including a band of 45 Bulgarian gypsies who are bound for Manitoba to take up farming. The steamer also brought the crew of the N. S. schooner, "Garlic M. Wambach," abandoned at sea, on January 13. The crew had been rescued by an Italian steamer and landed at Genoa. The crew state that Captain Hall Conkum of LaHave, N. S., was swept overboard and drowned when the vessel carried with her masts snapped off.

WATER DISTILLING PLANT FOR SYDNEY

SYDNEY, Feb. 21.—Another industry in course of promotion which will be located in this city is a water distilling plant. W. A. Winfield, manager of the Telephone Co., one of the chief movers in the affair, corroborated the story this morning. The plant will cost very little to install and will use the city water, distilling and bottling it. The cost to both producer and consumer will be comparatively small and when compared with the water secured by the drinking of pure water is hardly to be considered.

Plants of the same description are in operation in nearly every city in Canada and the United States, this province being the last to take up with the idea.

The water which is being consumed by the people in Sydney is very often impure. Water secured from artesian wells contains too much lime, which causes hardening of the arteries, gall stones, etc., therefore soft water, chemically pure, should prove a boon in the summer months, when the city supply is very often insufficient and dirty.
