MacLean) had only to appear to hold the centre of the stage. The solos given between acts by Mr. Bud Mountain of Summerside were much appreciated. In spite of unfavorable weather almost \$100.00 was realized. Too much credit for the success of the play cannot be given to Rev. W. E. and Mrs. Aitken who gave so unsparsingly of their time and talent.
