ship plates. Canadian shipyards had not gone far in the building of steel vessels before they realized their dependence on the United States for plates. The United States authorities did their best to keep Canada supplied during the war, but owing to the great home demand it was impossible to do all that was desired.

It is probable that \$5,000,000 represents the total investment in all shipyards, exclusive of working capital. In the steel shipbuilding plants about 23,500 men are now employed. It is estimated that an equally large number of workmen are engaged in the production of ship plates, shapes, machinery furnishings and general equipment.

Nine-Ten Steel Shipbuilding Plants. From being in a position in which according to the statement of the shipbuilders themselves "Prior to the outbreak of war steel vessels were built in Canada in only shipyards which produced intermittently a small tonnage of lake cargo, and passenger vessels, scows, dredges, buoy steamers, etc."

Investment and Workmen Employed. The investment in the Canadian shipbuilding industry is now (1920) very large, that in the plants constructing steel vessels, being estimated at \$47,000,000. As there are also 250 yards of one kind or another turning out wooden ships,

geographical situation, to the absence of a sea-faring population, and to the lack of the materials out of which ships both steel and wooden are built, but to indifference. Nor can it be said that Canada has lacked the required mechanical skill in construction, for her record during the war, considered both from the standpoint of quality of speed and of tonnage turned out, bears this. The decline of shipbuilding in Canada and the decrease also in Canadian tonnage, has been one of the severest blows that the industry and commerce of the Dominion has sustained.

That fifty-seven years ago the provinces now comprised within Eastern Canada built and sold to other countries \$9,000,000 worth of shipping; whereas in the fiscal year 1918, in spite of the unprecedented demand for tonnage, the value of vessels sold to other countries was only \$5,500,000, is a striking example of what has been lost through the decline of shipbuilding activities. With such an industry established on a permanent basis, and possessing a reputation for excellence of workmanship—what a harvest Canada might have reaped.
