NEWS FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD

Paragraphs of Interest Gathered From Various Sources—
What is Happening in Other Countries—A Record of Events Worthy of Note.

Women are replacing men as servants in houses of the wealthy in London. Housemaids and parlour-maids are still required, but chefs, butlers, and men-servants generally, are to an increasing extent becoming luxuries of the past. The old idea "establishment" no longer obtains in the modern smart set who prefer the irresponsible life of flats or hotels to the care of a large house and servants. A generation ago men servants in large houses invariably brought up their children to follow in their footsteps, but now girls are getting into the post-office, and boys are trained as chauffeurs. Many society women have engaged smart parlor maids to take the place of the old-time butlers, with excellent results. Keeping down expenses is one of the main reasons for the change, sleeping accommodation for men servants proving a considerable tax on the small but highly rented town houses, while there is also a question of taxation which falls on those who employ men servants.

From the American mine at Cobalt, Ont., a day or two ago there was shipped to Mr. Earl of New York a ton of silver ore so pure that all it requires is the stamp of the mint to make it coin. Mr. Earl it may be said is the chief owner of the mine. Computed at 80 cents to the ounce, the value of the shipment would reach \$120,000. About 100 men are employed, and there are night and day shifts. It is expected that this force will be doubled in the spring.

The new editor of the Scotsman, the great newspaper of Edinburgh, J. P. Croal, is a London journalist, and is now to be simply in clover. For he is the most ardent and expert of golfers, one of the founders of the parliamentary golf handicap, and famous on the Tooting links. In Edinburgh he will be in his glory, and to edit the Scotsman a mere bagatelle.

No doubt is entertained, says a British naval paper that when Sir Charles Drury goes to sea, Prince Louis of Battenberg will relinquish the command of the Second Cruiser Squadron in order to return to Whitehall. His Serene Highness, after waiting upon the King on his return from his Canadian and American mission went to his estate in Germany, rehoisted his flag in the Drake at an early date, in readiness to take part in the combined manoeuvres, and the intention is that he shall not be relieved of his command until the year's tactical training, including the grand manoeuvres in June, has been completed. Unless rumor is very much astray, Prince Louis will then become the Second Sea Lord of the Admiralty. While the officers and men of the Drake will keenly regret the conclusion of a particularly pleasant and happy period of service, Prince Louis will be welcomed back to London very heartily.

In view of the fact that the claim to the possession of "the original and only authentic" portrait of Shakespeare is made by Shakespeare House of Almondbury, Huddersfield, it is noteworthy that the value of what are regarded as other genuine pictures of the poet has never been accurately ascertained.

EGYPT WANTS ONLY CAPITAL

CAIRO, Feb. 24.—The prosperity of Egypt is one of the really remarkable things of the century. This prosperity has not been due solely to the extension of the railways and the increase of business on the canal. It has been pronounced along all lines except in the business of cattle growing where the recent plague has caused a depreciation in values, and the ravages of cotton caused by the "boll worm" in Upper Egypt. But except in these minor details, even Sir Vincent Corbett, financial adviser to the Egyptian Government, says that the rapid advance in the prosperity of Egypt which characterized 1903 and 1904, has to all outward appearance, at least been maintained.
