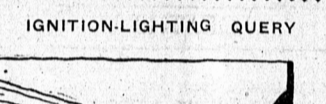

### HINTS FOR The Motorist

### IGNITION-LIGHTING QUERY



M. H. asks: On a Ford car, which is the better arrangement: to operate the ignition from the magneto and the lights from a dry-cell battery or to use the battery for ignition and run the lights from the magneto? Answer: Operating the lights from dry cells would prove rather expensive if you used them more than very sparingly and you would find a storage battery a more economical source of current. Operating the regular vibrating-coil equipment from dry-cells would also use up batteries very fast, and if you wish to use battery ignition, you had better install one of the special timer-distributor single-coil outfit which are very economical of current. Probably you would find that running the lights from a storage battery and the ignition from the magneto would be the more satisfactory method, everything considered, although reserving the magneto for lighting and installing an improved ignition system supplied from dry-cells should give you fine results.
