BRITAIN'S DREADNOUGHTS. Sir.—Referring to your editorial in issue of 31st of March in which you placed before your readers the number of British Dreadnoughts which will be adopted in 1912, it must be galling to Canadians of British blood to see no mention of Canadian Dreadnoughts, when those of Australia and New Zealand are mentioned by the First Lord of the Admiralty, as being afloat and ready for service at a time when it is claimed by many of those who ought to know, that there is a very real danger of trouble between the motherland and Germany.

What did Mr. McKenna, First Lord of the Admiralty say? His words are as follows:—"The two ships (Dreadnoughts) which are being built by the Australian and New Zealand Governments will be completed by the summer of 1912. Editor Guardian.—A short time ago a bill was placed before our Local Parliament and, later, passed, vesting certain church properties in Prince County in the Church of Scotland. Among the properties described is an acre of land at Wilmot Creek, known as the Wilmot Cemetery, held in peaceable possession by the people of the locality for over sixty years, and used by various denominations as a burial place for their departed dead; also half an acre of land located at Searletown, with a church building thereon. The owners of both these properties were never at any time under government or jurisdiction of the Church of Scotland and were not consulted in the matter of transferring the properties. The parties whose names appear as trustees, headed by a minister of the Church of Scotland, never had at any time any right, title or interest in these properties. The transaction appears to have been concocted in a mysterious manner and got through Parliament without the knowledge or consent of the real owners of the properties who, if they had known it, would have taken steps to oppose it. Doubtless they will now, that their attention has been called to it, take the first opportunity of having the matter rectified.
