## YESTERDAY IN THE LEGISLATURE

### The Chancery Bill Considered in Committee

Wednesday, February 23. The Speaker took the chair at 3 o'clock.

MR. MATHIESON had given notice that he would ask the Leader of the Government.

(1) Has any memorial or writing respecting the claims of this Province against Canada been prepared by this Government or by any committee thereof or by any committee appointed by this House at the instance of the Government since the 30th day of September A. D. 1908.

(2) Has any correspondence taken place between this Government of Canada or any member or officer thereof respecting such claims or any of them.

(3) Have any Orders in Council been made or passed in the above matter.

(4) Have any and what delegation or delegations proceeded to Ottawa or elsewhere respecting said claims.

(5) To lay on the table of this House all such memorials, correspondence, minutes of Council and other writings or certified copies thereof, with a detailed statement in writing with dates of the proceedings taken by or on behalf of this Government to present said claims or any of them to the Government of Canada and to press for the settlement of the same and also an itemized statement of the cost incurred up to the present time in relation thereto.

MR. MATHIESON only asked the last of these questions, No. 5.

THE PREMIER promised the information asked for would be laid before the House.

THE PREMIER again moved the House into Committee on the bill to amend and consolidate the acts relating to the Court of Chancery. Mr. McWilliams in the chair.

In course of the discussion in committee Mr. Cox raised the question of fees, which he thought had been too great in the past.

The Premier said that in some cases the fees would be less than before, and in no case greater.

Just before 6 o'clock the committee rose and progress was reported.

The House adjourned till 3 o'clock tomorrow.

### MISSING MAN AND HORSE ARE SAFE

ST. JOHN, Feb. 22.—The mystery surrounding the whereabouts of Milford Farris, of Sheriff street, who has been absent from the city since Tuesday last with a horse and sleigh, the property of Short's livery stable, has at last been cleared up. A reliable source last evening to the effect that Farris was a day or two ago, at Wickham. He was held up there by the storm last week. Mr. Short's horse, it was said, was being well cared for at the time. It is expected that Farris will return to the city today or tomorrow.

This news will come as a great relief to the relatives and friends of the missing man, who were beginning to entertain fears that some mishap had overtaken him. It also disposes of the theory that he might have gone through the ice and been drowned.

Farris, as told in the Telegraph yesterday, hired the horse from Short's Stables last Tuesday, saying that he was going to Belleisle after his wife.

### YOUTHFUL BRIDE TOOK HER LIFE

ST. JOHN, Feb. 22.—A peculiarly sad case of suicide occurred yesterday at Mechanic's Settlement, King's county. Mrs. Josiah Anderson, a young woman of about twenty, who was married only ten days ago, was the victim, having taken her life by swallowing Paris green. Only an outline of the tragic story was obtainable last evening. The young woman's husband, who owns a farm on Smith's Creek, has been working in the lumber woods at Mechanic, near the home of Mrs. Anderson's father, Robert Wortman, with whom they resided temporarily. After their marriage ten days ago the young couple drove to Anderson's home at Smith's Creek. They returned to Mechanic about a week ago, and he went to the woods.

### POPULAR RECREATION

The recent events of Maritime interest which have been taking place in the Arena Rink in this city have forced citizens and all interested in healthy recreation and clean sport to realize that this new rink is a building of which the city should reasonably feel proud. The old-time open air rink, which, by the way, was situated almost exactly on the same site as that of the present building, has not been forgotten by its patrons, numbers of whom are still citizens, lawyers, and other professionals and business men. They and all who remember the time spoken of, can call to mind the first long talk of skating rink which was at the time of its erection an up-to-date building. The change then in later years with the increasing number of skaters and lovers of the accompanying sports it became evident that the capacity of the old rink and its subsequent successor was inadequate to accommodate the attending crowds.

The erection of a larger building was considered quite a few years before any definite step was taken, and it was left to a number of the younger citizens to show their business capability by getting the necessary capital and securing plans for a newer and more modern building.

This was done and to these young men, all prominent in sporting circles, the credit for the splendidly equipped Arena belongs. Their investment has proven a remunerative one and their every effort to entertain the public and afford all opportunities for enjoying practically the only recreation during the winter months has received the hearty encouragement and support of hundreds of citizens.

Speaking of attendance it can be said that the largest crowd yet assembled in the new rink was at the opening of the first Maritime Championship events ever held in this province, a feature impossible in former years, at which time (February 6th, 1907), A. W. Gaudet established a new Maritime Record for the three mile distance lowering for the old one from 10.30 to 9.35 minutes against Bart Duffy, of St. John, who was the principal attraction of the meet. Since then the crowds have been taxing the capacity of 2000, though no later attraction has ever drawn a similar number.

## CALLS ROSTAND A "LITERARY THIEF"

CHICAGO, Feb. 22.—Samuel Eberley Gross, of Chicago, who accused Rostand of having plagiarized from the Merchant Prince of Cornville two plays—Cyrano de Bergerac and Chanticleer—sent a cablegram today to the French Academy, denouncing M. Rostand as a "literary thief" and demanding an investigation of M. Rostand's right to be a member of that organization.

Mr. Gross asks that a court consisting of three men be appointed to hear the evidence submitted by M. Rostand and himself and to let its decision as to the authorship of the plays be final.

## SENENCED TO JAIL FOR SELLING LIQUOR

MONCTON, Feb. 22.—Mrs. Wallace proprietress of the American Hotel, was today sentenced to one month in jail for Scott Act violation, and another case against her on a similar charge was adjourned for a week. Ned Melanson, clerk at the American, was put upon his defence.

## PORTUGAL FEARS INSURRECTION

Widespread Plot Discovered and Arms Being Smuggled Across Border.

Confidential information has reached the authorities that a cargo of arms and ammunition for the revolutionists is being brought from Germany.

A keen watch at all ports has been ordered and the coast is patrolled by troops.

## RYAN ON STAND IN LIBEL SUIT

TORONTO, Feb. 22.—Peter Ryan was the chief witness in the Foster-Macdonald libel suit today. He told the Kamloops (B. C.) Lumber deal, which he sold to Geo W. Fowler for \$170,000, and by arrangement charged \$225,000, returning the odd \$50,000 to Fowler in cash and giving security for \$5,000.

Ryan received the \$225,000 from the Union Trust Company.

The evidence given by Foster in his examination for discovery, was read to the jury as it is not likely Foster will give evidence at the trial.

George E. Buchanan, of the Bank of Nova Scotia, Toronto, swore that on Feb. 12, 1904, Fowler had a little over \$17 to his credit and on that day a check from Peter Ryan for \$12,000 was paid to his account. Special to The Guardian. BERLIN, Feb. 23.—The National Zeitung says Canada has been prejudiced against Germany by the English Imperialists and protectionists and asserts that the Canadian newspapers obtain news about Germany through London.

"This news," it says, "is frequently mendacious."

The paper suggests that attention in Berlin might be directed towards organizing a scheme whereby Canada may receive German news from Germany and concludes by denouncing the Conservative newspapers of London as hostile to an incredible degree.

The effect of the recent financial disturbances upon various industries and trades is much less than perhaps might have been expected; indeed, the business activity and prospects are better this week than last as is clearly indicated by the more optimistic reports from the iron and the dry goods trades and upon the advices from the leading distributing centers. That the distribution of products continues heavy is made manifest by the increase of 16.6 per cent in railroad earnings in the first week of February.
