## CONVENTION OF RAILWAY EMPLOYEES

MONCTON, May 9.—The Intercolonial Railway will be well represented at the annual Convention of the Brotherhood of Railway Employees which meets in Boston next week. The I. C. R. representatives being Messrs J. W. Clarke, and Quebec will leave today for Boston, where the Convention opens on Monday and continues for a week.  
From New Brunswick there will be seven delegates. Of these Moncton contributes four, the local representatives being Messrs J. W. Clark, S. C. Alward, Wm. Perry and Chas. Cole. There will be one delegate each from Campbellton, Newcastle and St. John.  
Other portions of the railway will also be well represented. From Prince Edward Island there will be four delegates, three from Halifax, one each from Sydney, Pictou, Truro Lewis and River du Loup will each send two delegates.

## METROPOLITAN LINE

Direct All-Water Route Between New York and Boston  
Fast Turbine Steamships "Yale" and "Harvard"

BOSTON, May 9.—The direct passenger service between New York and this city—all the way by water via Long Island Sound and the Atlantic Ocean—was inaugurated last season—will be resumed for the season of 1908 on Monday, May 11th.  
The Express Triple Screw Turbine Steamships Yale and Harvard were built especially for this route and their patronage at once demonstrated the great interest of Travelers, Shippers and the public generally in these unusually fast and luxurious Steamships.  
The route, too, came in for its share of extraordinary interest, for never before had a direct Passenger and Express Freight service between New York and Boston all the way by water been attempted.  
The service was popular from the start. The great steamships were tested to their capacity on every trip, and the continued success of the enterprise seems assured.  
The Yale and Harvard maintain an hourly speed of 24 miles and make the run direct between New York and Boston in 15 hours—leaving either city every day in the week at five o'clock in the evening; due in the other at eight o'clock the following morning.  
The Restaurants on the Harvard and Yale compare favorably with those of your club or home.  
The Dining Room is reached directly from the Social Hall on the main deck, and the windows all look directly out to sea, enabling passengers to enjoy the passing panorama while they dine.  
There are electric lights and steam-heating equipments in state rooms.  
There is wireless telegraphic service on board for the protection of the ships and convenience of passengers, who are thus enabled to telegraph to their friends in any part of the world and to communicate with friends on other vessels equipped with such service.  
The Submarine Signal Service, the latest device for aiding and safeguarding navigation, is also installed on board.  
In the Harvard and Yale there are more rooms equipped with private baths and toilet accessories than in any other steamships of their size in the country.  
The route followed by the Metropolitan Outside Line is sometimes supposed to be by way of Sandy Hook, Nantucket Light-Ship, etc. Perhaps the use of the word "outside" has given the impression. This, however, is wrong. The route follows the same course as is followed by the Long Island Sound Steamers, and then continues out on the Atlantic Ocean, thence through Vineyard Sound near the southern extremity of Cape Cod, then through Nantucket Sound, and again out on the Atlantic Ocean around Cape Cod, and on to Boston.  
The Steamships Harvard and Yale are of the new celebrated Turbine type—the very latest scientific application of steam to marine propulsion. The success of the turbine principle throughout the world re-

sulted in the adoption of this type in the vessels here mentioned.  
Each of these new powerful ocean-going Steamships is 407 feet long and 63 wide. Horse-power 10,000.  
For the propulsion of vessels the turbine was not successfully employed until 1894. Experience with the first vessels fitted with these engines brought to light unsuspected difficulties not encountered on land, and these took time for over-coming, thus it is that the perfect steam turbine for marine propulsion represents the most advanced modern and progressive engineering.  
The Turbine may be described as an engine which permits steam to pass, without interference of intermediate cranks or arms, directly against discs sealed to the shaft, thereby forcing the shaft and propeller to revolve and propel the ship.  
Innovations on the Yale and Harvard are the Smoking Room and the deck of the hurricane deck, and the stately Writing Room in the Main Saloon.  
The Barber Shop is located on the main deck near the Purser's office, while the book, periodical and news stand is located in the Main Saloon forward.  
The Metropolitan Steamship Company has for nearly fifty years operated an extensive All-the-Way-by-Water Freight Service between New York and Boston. The question of an All-Water passenger route has been discussed continuously during all these years, but it remained for the present owners of the Company to conclude that the time had arrived when there was a demand for such a service, which could only be satisfied by the construction of vessels of the type of the Yale and Harvard, so that it would be possible to make the run between the two cities in fifteen hours or less, at an average speed approximating twenty-four statute miles per hour.  
The following steamers of the Metropolitan Line are engaged exclusively in freight service: H. M. Whitney, H. F. Dimock, James S. Whitney, Herman Winter.  
The Harvard and Yale carry Passengers, Express Freight, Horses and Automobiles.  
The Metropolitan Line affords the most satisfactory facilities for the transportation of Horses and Automobiles between New York and Boston.

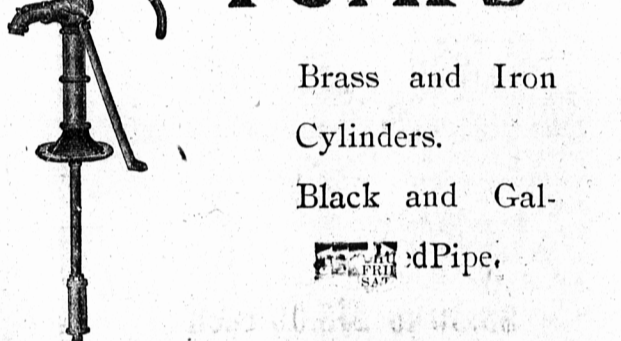
