GREAT PRIVACY FOR DR. CRIPPEN.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—The London morning newspapers print wireless despatches from the SS. Megantic which say that Dr. Crippen and Mrs. LeVeve are making the voyage from Quebec to Liverpool in complete seclusion.

It is understood that the prisoners will be landed secretly either at Holyhead or by private tug in the Mersey. The customary permits to board the Megantic at Liverpool have been withdrawn.

MANY LIVES LOST.

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 25.—Forest fires have slain more than 200 persons, nearly all of them fire fighters, in Idaho, according to figures compiled last night from the latest reports.

While 900 forest rangers are missing in Idaho and Montana, it is probable that most of them will escape danger. The telephone lines through the national forests have been destroyed or interrupted and the rangers may be safe, although unable to report.
