RALPH CONNOR PREACHES IN LONDON CITY TEMPLE

LONDON, Oct. 17.—The anniversary of the arrival of the first contingent on October 15 was marked by a dinner held on Saturday for non-commissioned officers and men on the staff of the Pay Record Office, and it happened today the chief non-conformist church, the London City Temple, heard "Ralph Connor" on Canada and the war.

The dinner was presided over by Acting Sergt. D. M. Patterson, and a large number of officers were guests. It was held at Holborn restaurant. Colonel Ward explained that no one desired a convivial gathering, as such, and that this was merely a social gathering to round off the historic event and the year of strenuous work, during which the roll had increased from a dozen to over 400. A large number of the men present were married or incapacitated while on active duty.

Both morning and evening services at the City Temple were crowded to hear Captain Gordon ("Ralph Connor") who wore khaki. Speaking on Canada and the war tonight, Gordon said that Canadians had come across to help because they had the old blood of the motherland, and shared England's jealousy of its national honor.

In this connection he paid a tribute to Sir Edward Grey, who during the past week has been attacked. During the course of the address, which dealt with Canadian love of liberty, justice and expressing optimism as to the outcome, there was frequently loud applause, especially when the speaker rebuked trouble mongers and discord sowers.

Mrs. John Way, Hunter River, has received the following letter in answer to a note which she placed in the pocket of a Red Cross Shirt, which she made last winter. The second letter is in reply to one written by Mrs. Way to No. 2 Stationary Hospital, and both will be found decidedly interesting and go to show that the Red Cross funds, etc., are reaching their destination and are keenly appreciated.

43 Woodberry Grove, Tinsbury Park, London, N., August 31st, 1915.

Dear Madam:—A shirt which was made by you in Dec. last and to which you attached a note, has just reached my uncle, Private Holmes of the 3rd Battalion of the Canadians. He is now a prisoner of war in Germany and has written and asked me to thank you very much for your kind message and the shirt. He is not able to write much himself as the first two fingers of his right hand were blown off so you will understand him not writing himself and be glad to hear your kindness has been much appreciated.

It may interest you to know my uncle says the prisoners are being well treated by the Germans anyhow, at the camp where he is, Giessen. With many thanks, Yours truly, DOROTHY GELLAN.

No. 2 Stationary Hospital, First Canadian Expeditionary Force, Le Touquet, Paris-Plage, France, September 25th, 1915.

Mrs. John Way, Hunter River, Prince Edward Island, Canada.

Dear Mrs. Way:—Your letter of September 8th duly received and we have a ward, in our hospital, called "Prince Edward Island" and we have already received many articles and some money from people in your province, to help support same.

Capt. J. S. Walker from Charlottetown is our Quartermaster, and Nursing Sister Rena McLean, who is with me, is also from Prince Edward Island.

We have a large hospital, partly in the Gold Hotel Building and partly in tents, in all 840 beds. We are situated on the coast of France, about 40 miles behind the firing line, and get all our patients by ambulance train.

We will be very pleased indeed to receive any money or other articles the Red Cross Society, of Hunter River, may send us, and we thank you in advance for your interest in our work. At the present time we are looking forward to being very busy as we understand one of the biggest battles of the war is now raging.

As was natural, the President's fiancée made use of the newly-installed private telephone, which connects her home with the White House, and informed Mr. Wilson, who lost no time in causing an emphatic denial to be made.
