STOCK QUOTATIONS

Stock Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, May 29 (CP)—Export wheat business flourished today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with the United Kingdom taking 2,000,000 bushels of wheat and the United States 1,000,000 bushels of oats.

Trading in rye futures was irregular with May displaying only a thin trade, July firmness and October and December easiest.

Clover values were 5-8 higher to 1-2 lower with May at \$1.61, July \$1.56 3-4, October \$1.44 and December \$1.38 1-2-5-4.

TORONTO, May 29 (CP)—In the quietest market since July 10 to the Toronto Exchange Market, sagging today, meeting index losses for both mining groups and the Western Oils. The gold issues were down about a point at the close.

Weakness was mainly in evidence in the cheaper golds. Lake Shore was off 1-2 in light turnover and Bralorne and Kerr - Addison weakened 1-8. Other seniors held unchanged. East Sullivan was under selling pressure and it touched 5-40 before rallying to 5-70 where it was off 30 cents net.

MONTREAL, May 29 (CP)—Transactions on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market today were featured by a number of strong spots among recently active and higher industrial and steady to narrowly irregular tone in other key issues. Junior mines took tumbles on average in light turnover.

At new peaks in industrials were Cement, Cdn. Consumers Glass, Marconi, Locomotive, B.C. Packers, Gypsum and Massey Preferred. In the balance of trading in the section better marks were made by Cocksuit, Dairies, Canadian Car Stocks, Fleet, Dredge, Dominion Engineering and Sugar.

NEW YORK, May 29 (CP)—Stocks climbed to another 8-year average peak in today's market on the high successive advance despite scattered selling that shifted a number of leaders to the minus ranks.

Selective strength appeared after a steady opening. Dealings were fast at intervals but tended to slow when trends wavered. Closing gains of fractions to a point or so—there were a few wilder sprinters—were well in the majority.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 3 of a point at 66.6, best level since August 25, 1937. The industrial rail and utility averages posted new highs. The market exhibited breadth.

CHICAGO, May 29 (AP)—Grain futures were steady to strong today after an easy start. Wheat was up more than a cent at times, some of the strength being attributed to pessimistic private crop report on conditions in Kansas.

At the close wheat was 1 3-8-2 1-8 higher, July \$1.69 3-8-2-1-2. Corn was 1-1-4 higher, July \$1.18-3-8. Oats were 1 1-8-2 1-8 higher, July 64 5-8-3-4. Rye was 1-1-2 higher, July \$1.11 5-8-1-4-2 barley was 7-8-1-4 higher, July \$1.07.

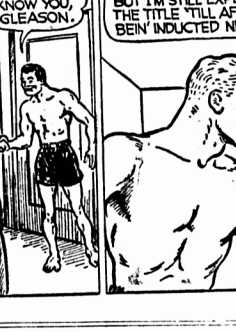
