

POLITICAL PARTIZANSHIP IN GREAT BRITAIN HOTTER AND YET MORE ENVENOMED

Coronation is Only a Recent Thing But the Amenities Then Are Forgotten and the Constitutional Question Has Worked Up the Parties to Renewed Bitterness

LONDON, July 3.—Intrigues of embittered partisans have followed rapidly upon the coronation rejoicings. Premiums for insurance against the risks of a general election have advanced sharply at Lloyd's though this fact would be more significant if the atmosphere there were not surcharged with conversation, so that bids could be entertained for insurance against the accession of Lloyd George to the premiership before the end of the year. Apart from the activity prevailing at Lloyd's there has been a sudden access of confidence among Tory zealots in both houses of parliament. The boldness with which the parliament bill has been amended in its committee stage is not a decisive sign of a revival of any fighting spirit among our lords, since the modifications may be intended for the purpose of drawing the government into a conference or defining the course which the unionists will take when they return to power.

THE KING'S EAGERNESS FOR A COMPROMISE

What is more important is the loud talk of certain peers in touch with the court about the king's willingness to create puppets and his eagerness for a compromise. It has inflamed the zeal of partisans, who are now assuming that the king has never committed himself without reserve to the creation of peers as an emergency measure and that a dissolution of parliament in the early autumn may enable the unionists to return to power as defenders of the crown.

tirely reassured until the prime minister declares formally that he is in possession of the royal guarantee, although they have professed absolute faith on that subject since Christmas. Mr. Asquith, of course, cannot say this without betraying the sovereign's confidence, and consequently the political game of blind man's bluff must be kept up for another fortnight.

IRRITATION AMONG LABORITES AND RADICALS.

Meanwhile, the motive of the chancellor of the exchequer for closing the committee stage of the national insurance bill by compartmentalizing it into a series of amendments has caused intense irritation among labor members as well as among unionists.

Another cause for discontent in the ranks of the radicals has been stimulated by the widespread rumor that the payment of salaries to members of the house of commons will be deferred to a more convenient season.

THE DECLARATION BILL WILL PASS

This is not likely to succeed, however, since the full force of the liberal and Irish coalition will be rallied after Sir Edward Grey had defended the measure in detail and the prime minister has reproached the unionists for being treacherous imperialists in affronting the colonial premiers. Unless all signs fail the declaration bill will be carried after the ministry has pledged itself to repair defects in the purchasing of two clauses, notable in respect to an ambiguous use of the words "enemy" and "base."

The results of the progressive diplomacy which characterized the last peace congress and the naval conference are fairly safe. The immediate effects of the deadlock between the houses are more doubtful, but it seems hardly credible either that the peerage will be permanently increased by the creation of hundreds of peers or that a general election will be brought on prematurely in the autumn, when the king has made full preparations for attending the coronation durbar at Delhi.

The probabilities point to the passage of the parliament bill in its original form when the lords are convinced that the prerogative of the crown is at the prime minister's disposal and that there has been a definite understanding between premier and king since the dissolution of the last parliament at the end of 1910.

The king and queen have arrived at Windsor, after passing through Eton. There will be a brief respite for them from the ceremonial of the last exhausting fortnight, and by the end of the week they will be heading for Ireland on the royal yacht.

A chapter of the Knights of St. Patrick has been decided upon as one of the events of the short Jubilee circuit, and the investiture for coronation honors has been reserved for Thursday, July 13, and will be one of the largest ceremonials of this kind ever known. Functions connected with orders of knighthood have become brilliant spectacles during the new reign.

HIGH SCHOOL BOY WEDS TEACHER TWICE HIS AGE

BAY SHORE, L. I., July 3.—That Charles Wilson Tutthill, eighteen years old, a member of the graduate class of the Bay Shore High School, had been married secretly for six months to his teacher, Miss Edith King, who is almost twice his age, became known today.

The wedding took place in Hoboken (N. J.), on New Year's Day, but was kept secret because teacher and scholar were afraid the other pupils would make fun of them.

Instead of the usual commencement exercises, the eighteen young men and women of graduating class of the High School went for a trip to Washington (D. C.), in charge of Professor James W. Alexander. Miss King asked permission to join the party. Instead of returning with the others, the couple remained over in Washington and returned yesterday morning.

Mr. Tutthill took his bride to the home of his mother, Mrs. Alexander, in First Avenue. When she answered his ring, he said: "Mother, I have brought home my wife. We were married in Hoboken on New Year's Day last. I kept it a secret because the fellows would 'kid' us so."

Mrs. Tutthill has been her husband's teacher for five years. She came to Bay Shore after being graduated from Bay State Normal School, at Cortland, in 1899. She is a handsome woman, thirty-five years of age, with black hair and black eyes. Her husband is tall and thin, a decided blond, with big blue eyes.

From the time he entered the High School, a lad in knickerbockers, the attachment between him and Miss King was pronounced. Soon after his marriage he was taken down with mumps, and the mystery of the special delivery letters, which were sent to him every day during his illness, is now revealed.

Mrs. Edwards was aware of her son's infatuation for his teacher, and is said to have offered him \$1,000 a year for four years if he would break off the attachment and go to Union College.

Mr. and Mrs. Tutthill left last night for Morrisville (N. Y.), where the bride's father is pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal church. Mrs. Edwards closed her house today and hurried away to Thousand Islands.

CANADIAN NORTHERN WILL BRIDGE ON EASTERN CANADA

TORONTO, July 3.—The Canadian Northern will begin a policy of steam railway development in western Ontario, will ask no subsidy from the Ontario government, and build to Hamilton, thence to Niagara. It will use the Electrical Power Development Company right of way and ultimately run the Canadian Northern trains to every centre of consequence in eastern Canada. "It is the policy of the Canadian Northern Railway ultimately to place itself in connection with all the important manufacturing and trade centres of eastern Canada in order to provide return freight for our western laden trains."

In the above and other statements made by Sir Donald Mann, vice-president of the Canadian Northern Railway, during an interview today, it is indicated a highly important development in that unique business combination known the world over as "MacKenzie & Mann."

SIR WILLIAM MACDONALD'S LATEST GIFT TO MCGILL

MONTREAL, July 5.—At a meeting of the Governors of McGill University it was announced that Sir Wm. Macdonald had completed the purchase of the Molson and Law estates adjoining Mount Royal Park and that it was his intention to present the property to McGill University, to be used for extension purposes, a leading feature of which will be the new Campus and residential buildings. The price paid was over a million dollars.

Including the cost of the Macdonald College and its endowment this brings the total of Sir William's gift to McGill within a few thousands of \$10,000,000.

BUILDING BRISK AT CAMPBELLTON

CAMPBELLTON, July 3.—The building inspector's report for June is very encouraging. Thirty-two permits have been issued for buildings to the value of \$111,950, three of those buildings to be brick and one brick veneered. In May there were 29 permits issued, the value being \$168,700.
