ROBERT WALKER WINS NEW LAUGHS IN "WHAT NEXT, CORPORAL HARGROVE?"

Robert Walker revives the infectious warmth and humor of his celebrated "Private Hargrove" characterization in M-G-M's sequel to the popular G. I. adventures, "What Next, Corporal Hargrove?" which opened today on the Prince Edward screen.

Reunited with his buddy of the earlier film, the raketeering Pvt. NATURALIST PASSES

BOSTON, Jan. 9 —(AP)—Dr. Thomas Barbour, 71, one of the world's most widely known naturalists, died tonight in hospital.

A graduate of Harvard and holder of doctorates from several other universities, he was a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, the Royal Asiatic Society, American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Author of several books and scientific papers, Dr. Barbour had made extensive zoological explorations in the East and West Indies, India, Burma, China and South and Central America for the Harvard Museum of Comparative Zoology.

DEADLY SPOTTED TYPHUS REPORTED

PRAGUE, Jan. 9 —(Reuters)—Deadly spotted typhus has broken out in many places in Eastern Europe, and inhabitants of some 100 villages are dying fast of hunger, want and disease. It was disclosed here today.

Although the typhus has not yet reached epidemic proportions, health services are so inadequate that local authorities have no idea how many are ill or have died of the disease.

Almost all of the villages affected were completely destroyed in months of bitter fighting between the Russian and German armies last winter. The people are living in the remnants of battered houses, in holes in the ground or, if they are very lucky, in huts provided by Slovak and Ukrainian authorities.

In hospitals, two or even three children share the same bed. Most of the 200,000 people who are exposed to these terrible privations are Ukrainians and were under Hungarian rule from 1939 until the Russian armies liberated the region last spring.
