SCHOOL BOARD.—At the meeting of the School Board Monday night the following appointments were made. Mr. Louis Wynne was appointed principal of Queen Square School in place of Mr. Francis who handed in his resignation. Mr. Leo McDonald was appointed to take Mr. Wynne's place while Mr. Leo Neilligan of Tignish took Mr. McDonald's place. Miss Hazel Moran was appointed as an extra teacher in Queen Square School. In West Kent School Mr. L. Campbell, former principal of Spring Park School and Miss Elinor Webster were appointed to the teaching staff. It was decided that no boy or girl could enter a school without being vaccinated.

A GOOD SHIPMENT.—Mr. William Cook, of Pine Hill, Nfld., crossed Monday morning by the Harland from Montague to Pictou taking away with him seventeen horses and 23 cattle, purchased from Mr. D. M. McDonald Charlottetown, and Mr. M. W. Wood, Highland Farm, Southport. This was Mr. Cook's first visit to the province and he expressed himself as greatly pleased with the quality of the stock procurable here. One pair of the horses he bought weighed 3,000 and were splendid animals. He intends returning in the near future.

VISITORS SURPRISED.—Mr. C. T. Shipley and Mr. H. C. Pugsley of River Hebert, N. S., are making an auto tour of the province and have so far driven over a considerable portion of the Island, having visited Charlottetown, Montague, Georgetown and other parts. They are delighted with their visit and the general appearance of the province. They are particularly impressed with the general excellence of the roads, which was a complete surprise to them. Mr. Shipley, on the way over by the car ferry, had picked up a Charlottetown newspaper in which the dangers and the awful condition of the Island roads were set forth in terrifying headlines, and he naturally expected to be mired or shipwrecked. In fact he was almost induced to abandon the visit. He was therefore naturally surprised to find the roads not only much better than those of his own province but equal to any he had seen anywhere.

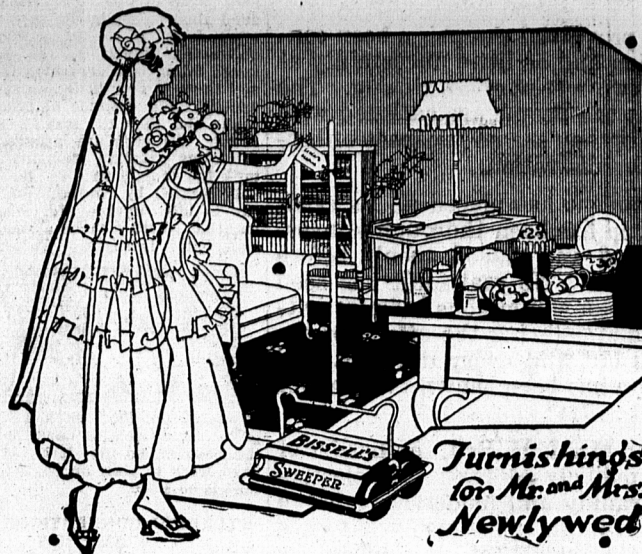

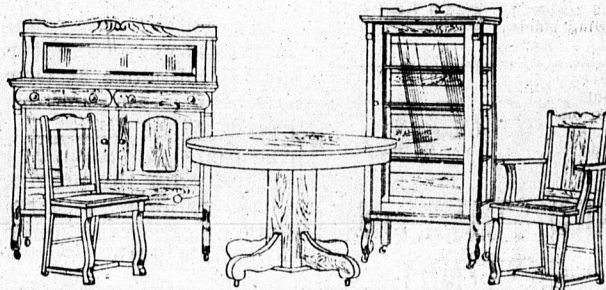
