REMOVE RUST STAINS

To remove rust stains from porcelain enamel bathroom or kitchen fixtures, try rubbing the spot with a cup lemon. Be sure, however, to wash the lemon juice off immediately and dry with a clean cloth. Acids, if allowed to remain on porcelain, are harmful to the glossy finish.

NEW USE FOR OLD HOSE

Old silk stockings are now being saved in the United States to send to China for use as bandages. Arrangements have been made in Portland for the stockings to be fumigated and packed by The Salvation Army. The bundles are then supplied to an airplane plant to be used as packing for crates of fighting planes being sent to China. Each bundle of 25 pair of stockings contains a circular written in Chinese and illustrated showing how to apply silk stocking bandages.

MAPLE SYRUP SPICE CAKE
2 cups flour
1-4 cup butter
1 cup maple syrup
1 egg
1-2 cup sour milk
1-2 teaspoon soda
1-4 teaspoon salt
1-2 teaspoon ginger
1-2 teaspoon cinnamon
1-2 teaspoon cloves
Cream shortening. Add maple syrup and beaten egg. Add sour milk alternately with the dry ingredients which have been mixed and sifted together. Bake in a shallow pan in moderate oven 350 F. for 25 minutes. Serve uniced.

BAKED INDIAN PUDDING
1 quart milk
1-2 cup molasses
1-3 cup corn meal
2 teaspoons ginger
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup cold milk
Put milk, scalded, over meal, and cook 20 minutes; add salt, ginger and molasses. Cook slowly in a buttered baking dish for 2 hours. When half done, add the cold milk and finish cooking. Serve with cream or ice cream.

FRUIT DRESSING

For fruit salads a French dressing made with a tart fruit juice, instead of vinegar, gives subtle flavor. Lime juice is a good substitute. It should be used in these proportions: one part lime juice two parts salad oil. Salt, sugar and paprika should be added to taste. Shake or beat the mixture until it is of light cream consistency. Lemon or pineapple juice are also good substitutes for vinegar.

ZESTY CANAPES

Here's a canape that will make a hit with your guests: Crisp crackers spread generously with cream cheese topped with cooked shrimps which have been dipped in Worcestershire sauce.

When making raisin bread, cookies, etc., cover the raisins with hot water and simmer them for about 5 minutes before using. They will be larger and softer.

ARCHBISHOP'S PAY

The \$1,500-a-year pension provided for Dr. Lang when he retired from the See of Canterbury may give him rather more of a margin than he has had from the \$15,000 official salary. This was reduced to about \$8,000 by taxation. Out of it two palaces, staff salaries and other expenses inseparable from the position have to be met, leaving a modest balance only for personal things. The extent of this can be guessed from a remark once passed by Dr. Lang that he could not send more than \$500 a year on himself. The late Dr. Temple was the last Archbishop of Canterbury to get nearly the whole value of the \$15,000 in those delightful days when income tax was about a shilling in the pound. His son, now the primate, will not be so happily situated.

TARTAR SAUCE

2 eggs, slightly beaten
1-2 teaspoon mustard
1 teaspoon salt
2 cups salad oil (about)
2 tablespoons lemon juice or vinegar
1-4 cup chopped stuffed olives
1-4 cup chopped parsley
1-4 cup chopped pickles
Method: Add the mustard and the salt to the slightly beaten eggs. Start beating with a Dover egg beater, adding a little oil at a time and continue beating and adding oil until the mixture is quite thick. Now add the lemon juice or vinegar along with the olives, parsley, and pickles. This will make quite a quantity of sauce, and if desired,

OATMEAL DROP COOKIES

1-2 cup fat
1-2 cup brown sugar
1-2 cup corn syrup
3-4 cup milk
2 cups rolled oats
1-2 cup raisins
1-2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon salt
3-4 teaspoon cinnamon
1-2 teaspoon cloves
1-2 teaspoon nutmeg
2-1/2 teaspoons baking powder
Cream fat, add brown sugar and corn syrup, blending together thoroughly. Stir in milk, add raisins and cinnamon; mix well. Mix and sift flour, salt, spices and baking powder, add to first mixture and beat thoroughly. Drop by spoonfuls on a greased baking sheet and bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees F.) for 15-20 minutes. Makes four dozen medium sized cookies.
