Rural Electrification in Manitoba

In preparation for the proposed electrification of farms in Manitoba after the war, the Manitoba Power Commission is undertaking a general survey of the farms and a promotional campaign.

They are told that 75 per cent of the farms are electrified in Sweden and New Zealand, and that 85 per cent or more have electric current in Denmark, Holland and France.
