From these two quotations, it will be appreciated that his sketches are very human—so human that the book is warped by its prejudice of choice in studies. Statesmen and other politicians predominate, but there are such other personalities included as the Archbishop of Canterbury "this kindly, wise, courteous and conscientious Scotsman", Field-Marshal Lord Haig ("the stern and unbending champion of the rights of men"), Viscount Leverhulme (with whom "everything comes back to soap"), and the Earl of Lonsdale ("immaculately dressed, radiating good humor and genial kindness, with a large camellia in his buttonhole and a larger cigar in his mouth.")

Yet, among all the pages in this introspective volume, not one is spared for a study of Mr. Baldwin. To that extent it is incomplete, but Lord Birkenhead has admittedly not aimed at completeness. In the chapter devoted to Mr. T. P. O'Connor, the author frankly explains that he chose a certain number of subjects "who happened to interest me." So, presumably, Mr. Baldwin is not "interesting," at any rate, not to Lord Birkenhead; those who realize how personal friendships are marred or made by political potentialities can understand.

FINAL MEETING.—The Liberal Conservative Association held its final meeting for the appointment of delegates for the selection of candidates for the Federal Parliament to the coming convention on Tuesday, Dec. 9th, Saturday night when fifteen delegates were chosen from Charlottetown Royalty, completing a total of one hundred and twenty delegates. Reports from rural polls throughout the country indicate a similar enthusiasm to that of the city and prospects point to one of the biggest Liberal-Conservative Conventions ever held in this Province.

WHAT WOMEN CAN DO—It may be interesting and encouraging to women aspirants to leadership in so many of our social activities to note that two women have been returned as Governors in two States of the American Union: Mrs. Ross as Governor of Wyoming and Mrs. Ferguson as governor of South Texas. As Wyoming was the first state to introduce woman suffrage, it is not surprising it should be the first to elect a woman its governor. She will rule a country twelve times as large as Massachusetts. It is Mrs. Ross's proud position to rule over an area, the American papers tell us, much larger than France, more than five times as large as England and with resources far beyond those of the German Reich.
