Lady Follet And Christian Science

LONDON, June 9.—How the late Lady Blanche Follet, believing in Christian Science and declining medical attendance, though suffering from diabetes, died at her residence in Pont street, was told at an inquest at Chelsea.
A public inquiry had been insisted upon by Lady Teynham, a sister of Lady Follet.
Answering the coroner, Miss Joan Theodora Follet, a daughter of Lady Follet, said her mother refused to see a medical man on any account. Witness suggested it three times to her.
A Christian Scientist practitioner, Miss Lindsay, saw Lady Follet on Friday afternoon, continued witness. She was almost unconscious, and died at 10.15 on Saturday morning.

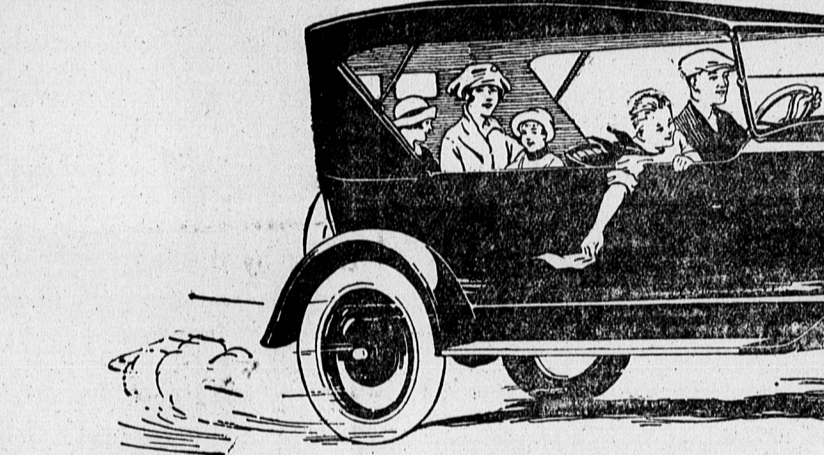
